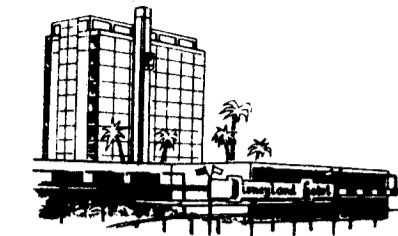

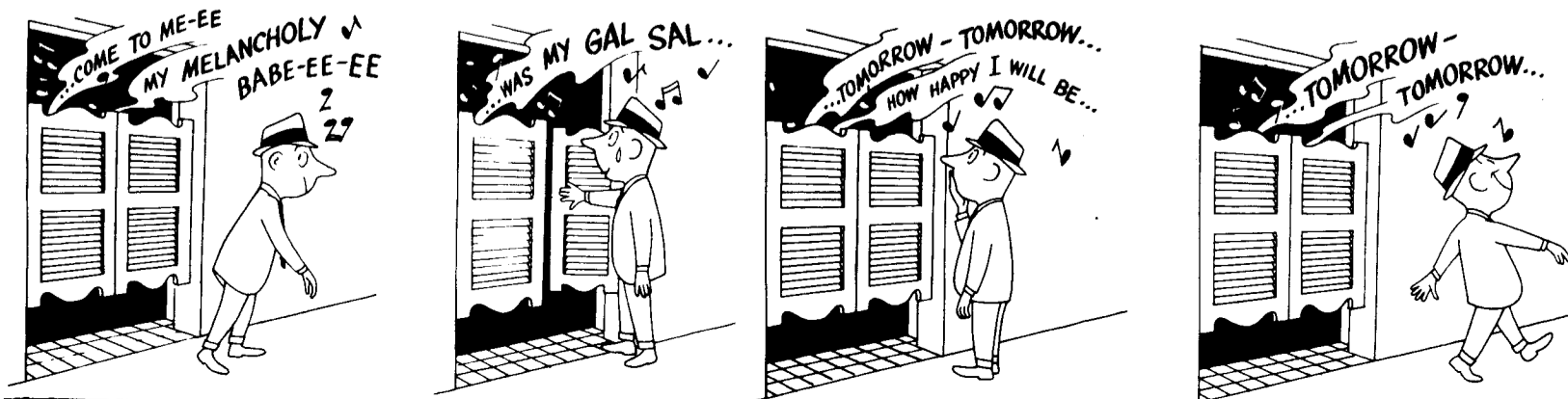

C.I.M. 17TH ANNIVERSARY A.A.
GREAT SUCCESS!!!!!!

"I had to endure three great losses before I could find myself"! Such was the theme of a great talk delivered by Dr. Dave S., San Louis Obispo, to several hundred inmates and guests attending the 17th Anniversary A.A. Banquet at California Institution for Men, Chino, Calif. Saturday, August 22.

"The first great loss was support. Being used to my wife's concern as to my most evident problem and suffering for so many years along with the constant worry of my close friends, it had a terrific effect upon me when she suddenly announced that there was a jug on the shelf in the kitchen for me to drink, and that she was going out to a movie. This could'nt be, I told myself. Hadn't she fussed, pleaded and become a neurotic because of my drinking—and at no time had left me alone with this biggest crisis in my life...but it had a pronounced effect on me...I was losing this support."

"The second great loss was control. It is a paradox. I drank to lose control, I sought control, even though I had drunk to lose it. However when I really lost it I lost my freedom. I had to abandon control and the habit of over expectancy (A concealed effort to control) which required personal discipline. As

St. Thomas said, 'A thing is not made less good because you happen to like it.' Personal discipline could be enjoyable just as sobriety could be enjoyable instead of the dreary non-living periods between drunks. In its place the wonderful urge to create instead of expecting others to stack up for us. We expected booze to do something for us, now we start doing things and feeling things in our own way."

The third great loss was the loss of love. We develop a self sufficiency during drinking. We have no capacity to give out, and we are left with utter loneliness. I had to get rid of the wall of self-sufficiency, and this could be done only with your help. I can only be truly me if you help me. To quote from the Bible, 'I was a stranger and you took me in'. I, myself, and you. With A.A.'s help I learned to endure these three great losses. It helped me through this temporary period of mourning over the loss of this great love affair I had with booze. Funny the worse it treats us, the deeper the addiction. I was suffering from a crippling capacity to love. With A.A.'s help my grief was properly assessed. "I started to drink to be free and adventurous and stopped for the same reason."

Dr. Dave continued, Referring to the Serenity Prayer, "I wanted to change other people because I wanted to control them. I find I can't control other people, I have to change me, but I can't do that alone, I need your help."

"This therapy is here for life. I'm thankful for the privilege of coming here. I need you as I will always need you," Dr. Dave concluded.

Much credit should be given to E.J. Oberhauser, Supt., R. Feigen, Asst. Supt. Sgt. J. Lytle, Group Sponsor, Father Cooney, Chaplain and former Group Sponsor, and other personel of C.I.M.; Inside Chairman, Jim S., Al L., recording secretary, Sarge C., Speaker and all those inside members who made the event such a wonderful success, from the chef and his crew who served such a delicious dinner to the band and vocalist who provided such great entertainment.

Bouquets should be tossed to the L.A. Institutional Committee, sponsoring the annual affair, noting especially Jack P., Caroline B., Harvey A., John A., Wes F., Tommy T., Judge Hughes of L.A., Friend of A.A., Dave N., Outside Chairman, and Bernice M. for her fine talk.

Al L. concluded the meeting with the following;

"We should give our home a devoted husband and father.

We should give our country a loyal, strong citizen.

We should give the world a lift toward that one far off Divine Event, towards which all creation moves.

But the finest gift a man can give his age and time is the gift of a constructive and creative life. And I wish each and everyone of you here, the will and the opportunity to give it." J.T.

FREEDOM

I found freedom only after coming to prison. Ridiculous, you say. Not really. When I think of all the things that bound me before I came here, these fences seem to be no bounds at all. Actually prison has freed me only because it has been the instrument that brought me to A.A. For it is through A.A. that I have been truly freed.

Oh it's true, I don't have complete freedom of movement; but then I didn't have this before I came here. I am not able to go home to my family every day. But, I never was able to. For, you see, I found it necessary to stop each night and have a drink before I went home. And more often than not I never got home. Or, if I did, I was in no condition to appreciate the wonderful home I had.

I am not allowed to work at the job of my choice, or to support my wife and children, but then I never held a job I really wanted. After the first dozen arrests, employers were not anxious to add me to their staff. And of course, the jobs I did find barely supported my drinking, and there wasn't anything left over for food or rent or any such extravagant luxuries.

Now, I'm not able to eat meals like "Mother used to make" but at least I am able to eat and eat regularly. It was a rare occasion when I was able to get enough money to drink and eat too, in the old days.

All in All, I find it less confining here than the trap I had lived in for years. For now when I do go to the dorm at night, it's with a feeling that I have done something that day which brings me a little closer to my waiting family. This is quite an accomplishment for someone whose every action in the past only served to drive his family away. And I am free to think and to plan a secure and happy future for my wife and children; where before this I could only scheme and plan to get another drink. I can sleep at night with a mind that is free from fear and doubt, for I know everything I have done during the day, and I know that I've committed no insane acts that I must answer for.

Yes, A.A. has freed me, freed me from doubt and fear, from frustration and compulsion, from guilt and re-

morse. I now await the day when I will be released and the transition from prisoner to free man will be complete. But this freedom can be short lived; and it will end the day I quit associating with A.A. Needless to say, I hope this day never comes. But in this program we don't worry about the days to come. I belong to A.A. today, and all all I can hope for is to be able to continue saying this.
