A. A. MEMBERS AND FRIENDS
URGED TO ATTEND!!!

Alcoholics Anonymous, under the auspices of the A.A. Central Office in Santa Ana, is scheduling a series of Open Meetings for the purpose of informing the general public about the disease of alcoholism, and making it aware of the availability of help for the alcoholic and of the work of Alcoholics Anonymous in this field.

Alcoholism has been classified as a disease by the American Medical Association. Quoting from Reader's Digest, September, 1964; as condensed from U.S. News & World Report, in an interview with Marvin A. Block, M.D.; "In 1956, the American Medical Association officially accepted alcoholism as an illness, and urged all general hospitals to treat patients diagnosed as alcoholics and all general hospitals to admit them. This is the first time that a medical organization has had to recognize a disease officially."

Alcoholics Anonymous, founded in 1935 has an imposing record of success in helping alcoholics, who want to stop drinking, to attain sobriety through its recovery program.

The first meeting will be held on October 23, 1964, from 8 to 10 P.M. at the Armed Forces Center, Barranca Rd., at Red Hill in Santa Ana.

It will be held jointly with the law enforcement agencies of the county and will be open to the public.

Inspector Harold L. Stallings of the Detective Division of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office will be the main speaker at this meeting. Inspector Stallings has worked with the Los Angeles Institutional Committee for a number of years.

Dates for future meetings have not been set, but A.A. Committee Members hope to hold one every 3 or 4 months with a separate portion of the community such as: the clergy, the medical profession,

municipal officials, welfare workers, employers, and the like.

Each meeting will present a speaker who is aware of the problem of alcoholism in his field and a second speaker who is an alcoholic.

It is suggested by New York that any A.A. members participating in these public meetings be brought in from outside areas in order to preserve the anonymity of the members of the immediate area. Hence, You will note on the accompanying letter that Jack P. of the Los Angeles Institutional Committee and Cliff W. of Whittier will present the A.A. viewpoint.

This accompanying letter is a copy of the original which is being sent to all members of the law enforcement agencies, and it is also hoped that A.A. members and their friends will be present in order to better understand the necessity for this type of meeting on a regular basis.

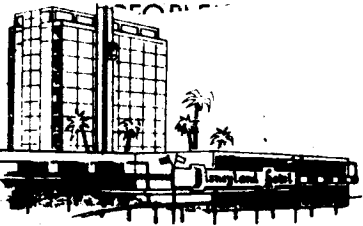

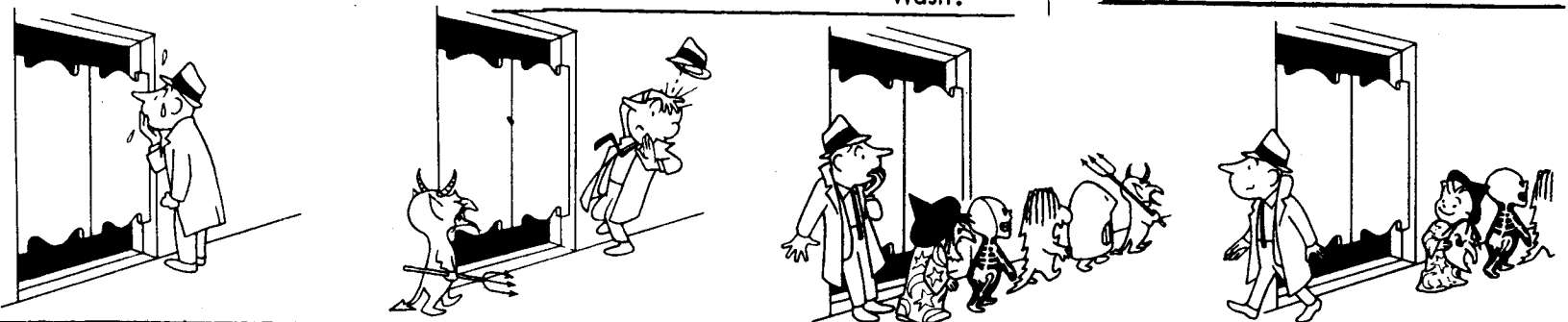

Only seventeen Groups out of a possible seventy-seven were represented at the September Intergroup meeting.

WHERE WAS YOUR REPRESENTATIVE? AND YOURS? AND YOURS?

Those who did "ANSWER THE CALL" expressed the conscience of their groups by voting:-

1. To approve the recommendation that John L., Director of the Institutional Committee, be made an Honorary, non-voting member of the Service Board.

2. To reject the proposed change to the By-Laws which, if passed, would have eliminated the rule that twelve duly elected G.R.'s be in attendance at a regular Intergroup Meeting before any business can be transacted. The winning "nays" argued that the passage of this amendment would result in rule by a minority.

These decisions were made by 22% of the eligible voters.

THIS IS A MAJORITY?????????????

We hope that this example of rule by a minority will not be repeated at the meeting to be held on October 27th when the representatives will nominate and elect four members to the Service Board.
