It was a pleasant surprise to those who called for the meeting that over 40 AA and Al-Anon members attended, all of whom promised to contribute in some manner toward assisting such a club. It was agreed to proceed with planning for the club, which will have the name, "Alano of Costa Mesa".

Thirty-three memberships were pledged at the Aug. 16th meeting at a charter membership fee of \$25 per year. A tentative location for the club was selected at 2040 Placentia St., Costa Mesa, and it was hoped that the opening of the club could be anticipated by September 1st.

Certain basic club policies were expressed at the August 16th meeting and later confirmed by the Organizational Committee:

- a) The club would be incorporated and would be managed toward the best interests of the majority of AA,Al-Anon and Alateen.
- b) Al-Anon and Alateen participation in all club activities is desired and solicited.
- c) A meeting hall will be available for scheduled meetings and social functions for AA, Al-Anon and Alateen.
- Family membership is solicited, with one membership applying to all members of an immediate family.

(Continued from page 1) of the best friends of our Committee and of"our"kind will retire from service within

the Sheriff's Department.

When our Committee first became an idea and help was so badly needed to aid us in gaining entre into the jail facilities of this area, we were directed by the then Sheriff Biscailuz to talk with a man who, as Captain of the cars and treatment division, would be the one either to help us or to tell us that there would be no place in the Sheriff's program for us. Wynn and Jack called up the Captain in his office and, with some misgivings, outlined what we felt was a real need in the area of alcoholic rehabilitation within the jail sys-

The Captain listened quite intently and then told us that he would tak, it up with the Sheriff and let us know immediately what the decision was, and shortly we were informed that our program would be welcomed in the program being established for inmate care and treatment.

In the intervening years, this man, with the full support of Sheriff Peter Pitchess, has been most helpful in not only the program of Alcoholics Anonymous, but in the entire field of alcoholism, acting as Sheriff Pitchess' representative on the Los Angeles County Commission on Alcoholism. The interest of the Sheriff's Department in this area was so deep that the Captain was sent to the Yale School of Alcoholic Studies for the summer session and has acted in behalf of Sheriff Pitchess on many panels covering the disc ssion of alcoholism throughout the years.

With the knowledge that the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department was solidly behind our program we were able to contact other institutions in the area and, referring to our program in the county jails were able to secure permission to carry the message

to those institutions also.

As the years went by, it became almost a habit to contactour 'benefactor' (The sheriff of L.A. County), who almost invariably would refer us to the Captain -- now advanced to the position of Inspector, and whatever our problems we always seemed to get the answer from him. Not once in the past 19 years has any request to the Sheriff been ignored, and so many times our friend gave us more of his time and

energies than he should have. Through the efforts of Sheriff Pitchess and the Inspector, and the Chief of the Care and Treatment Division, and his wonderful and capable staff, our program has grown to National prominence and has become the largest such effort in the entire world.
