" HINTS FOR HAPPY HOLIDAYS "

Dear G.S.O.

Holiday parties without liquid spirits may still seem a dreary prospect to new A.A.'s. But many of us have enjoyed the happiest holidays of our lives sober— an idea we would never have dreamed of, wanted, or believed possible when drinking. Here are some tips for having an all-round ball without a drop of alcohol:

1. Line up extra A.A. activities for the holiday season. Arrange to take newcomers to meetings, answer the phones at a clubhouse or Central Office, speak, or help with the dishes or visit the alcoholic ward at a hospital.
2. Be host to A.A. friends, especially newcomers. If you don't have a place where you can throw a formal party, take one guy to a diner and "spring" for his coffee.
3. Keep your A.A. telephone list with you all the time. If a drinking urge, or panic, comes— postpone everything else until you've called an A.A.
4. Find out about special holiday parties, meetings, or other celebrations given by groups in your area, and go. If you're timid, take someone newer than you are.
5. Skip any drinking occasion you're nervous about. Remember how clever you were at excuses when drinking? Now put the talent to good use. No office party is as important as saving your life.
6. If you have to go, and can't take an A.A. with you, keep some candy handy.
7. Don't think you have to stay late. Plan in advance an "important date" you have to keep.
8. Go to church. Any church.
9. Don't get tired, hungry, or lonely. Catch up on those books, museums, walks and letters.
10. Don't start now getting worked up about all those holiday temptations. Remember— "A Day At A Time".

11. Enjoy the true beauty of holiday lights, tinsel and joy. Maybe you cannot give material gifts— but this year, you can give love.
12. "Having had a..." No need to spell out the Twelfth Step here, since you already know it.

CONFERENCE AGENDA:

Already important topics are headed for discussion at the 17th General Service Conference in New York next April (pending final approval by the new Conference Agenda-Admissions Committee). They are:

1. Presenting the spiritual side of A.A. to the newcomer.
2. Choosing Conference Delegates for 3-year terms (effective 1970) instead of 2-year ones, as at present.
3. More effective message-carrying about world services by Delegates.
4. Instead of the present ceiling of \$100 for any member's support of world-wide 12th-Step work, raising the acceptable limit to \$200. Although costs and wages have risen during A.A.'s 31 year history, the pre-inflation limit on how much an A.A. can help support services has never been changed.

Your group may want to start discussing these matters at once, and share your ideas with your Delegate, so he can share them with the rest of us at the Conference.
