1. Where and when is the Convention?
 - A. SANTA MONICA, CALIFORNIA-OCTOBER 14, 15, 16, 1966.
 2. Why is the CONVENTION held?
 - A. Primarily the convention is a social event with fringe benefits both for the individual and AA as a whole, such as 3 days of wonderful helpful meetings, a chance to hear good speakers from all of California. Meet and greet friends that have scattered far and wide. Enjoy a fabulous show and dance. To see and realize the scope of AA at work every day of the year. Makes your heart fill with love and gratitude that you have a part in carrying the message and enjoying this wonderful new life given by AA.
 3. For whom is the CONVENTION held?
 - A. For all AA, Al-Anon, Alateen members and the families of each. The CONVENTION is not open to the general public. The attendance is controlled by registration.
 4. Who is required to register, how much, why?
 - A. All persons wishing to attend must register- be they AA, Al-Anon, Alateen, or Non-Alcoholic. The cost is \$1.00 per person. This keeps the CONVENTION strictly for whom it is intended.
 5. Where, how and with whom do I register?
 - A. Most logical at your home group with a secretary or representative known to you. But if you are unable to do this and you aren't asked, please call your Central Office in your area- they will be glad to help you. Register anytime- the sooner the better- this saves you and the registrar's office time and headaches.
 6. Is the registration badge important?

WOULD YOUR GROUP HELP ANOTHER ?

"I'm sure if two sick alcoholics in Ireland wanted AA help and wrote my Group, we'd write them regularly and do all we could to help," said one Delegate to the 1966 General Service Conference.

Another member, who works a lot with AA members in a state prison, said he was sure many prison members would love to write alcoholics overseas to 12-Step them by mail.

As AA grows more and more in many corners of the world, more and more newcomers need help in staying sober and getting a group going. Would your group be willing to help them?

Here's the idea. Get your Group's GSR to write GSO and tell us that your Group wants to help a lonely, faraway new Group. GSO will then put you in touch with a Group that wants to make friends by mail, and from then on it's up to your imagination.

Maybe you will exchange tapes with each other. Maybe you'll hold round-robin discussions of the Steps and discussions by letter.

It can be some of the most thrilling 12-Step work you'll ever do--to know you are helping and being helped by brother and sister alcoholics in a remote corner of the world. This round the world sharing of experience, strength, and hope is one way to make sure no alcoholic, anywhere ever feels alone again--if we really mean what we say

it when we say, "I am responsible."

Here are some samples of the kind of correspondence you may have:

From Ireland--or Philadelphia?

"In 1946 Conor F., AA member from Philadelphia, was visiting the land of his birth, Ireland. He read in a Dublin paper an interview with Father Tom D., an Australian priest who said he thought Dublin could use some AA.

Conor went to the hospital for the deranged' that Jonathan Swift of England had founded in exile 201 years earlier, and

talked to alcoholics there.,, in six months there were 8 or 10 sober, and AA was started in Europe.

"It's not really Irish, of course. William James, the great philosopher whose book, Varieties of Religious Experience, so influenced Bill W. and led to the 12 Steps, was American--and delivered his lectures in Edinburgh, Scotland. And if it hadn't been for the Aussie padre--Well, you see AA has no boundaries."

FROM AUSTRALIA...OR HUNGARY?

"Alex died at 48 in October, 1965, just before his third sober Christmas. He had joined AA in Sydney, and devoted his life to it after we moved to Victoria. He was a lawyer.

"When he heard his mother was ill in Hungary he went to see her. He told his best childhood friend, now a famous radiologist, about his alcoholism and his recovery in AA. As a result, the Hungarian government's 'Commission Against Alcoholism' had him speak.

"The Commission printed an article about AA in its magazine, and gave the Sydney Australia, Central Office address.

"Now a fellow named Tibor J., presently in a sanitarium in Hungary, wants help in starting a Group. Who will help?"

That's the kind of letter we get all the time at GSO, and our International Committee advises us on helping "anyone, anywhere, who reaches out for help--so the hand of AA can always be there."
