## 'SPONSORSHIP-- THE HAND OF A.A.' 1967 CONFERENCE THEME

Is A.A. sponsorship getting stronger or weaker? How can it be improved? Is it a group problem or individual problem? Does it affect an entire area?

These questions are on the agenda of the 1967 General Service Conference (Hotel Roosevelt, New York, Apr. 17-22).

It would be very helpful to all Conference Delegates and to G.S.O. if each group would discuss those and the other agenda items, so we can get a true reflection of the thinking of the whole Fellowship.

Since Delegates from five regions in the U.S. and Canada will nominate members for the General Service Board, this will be a historic Conference. Never before has the membership chosen so many trustees at one time.

Other topics are:

- (1) How can groups become better informed about A.A. as a whole?
- (2) How can we liven up "Service" meetings?
- (3) Make the G.S.R.'s job more meaningful and attractive?
- (3) How can areas make better use of the experience of past Delegates?

# 1ST STEP HOUSE WINS AWARD

## A TIME FOR HUMILITY

On Thursday, January 26th, a Disneyland Community Service Award of \$1000 was given to the First Step House of Costa Mesa, as an acknowledgement of distinguished community service. This award was all the more remarkable in that the decision to apply for an award and the preparation of the application was done in the last few hours before the deadline for such applications. There was splendid work done by a few AA members in preparing the application, and several Costa Mesa city officials contributed by recommending the Step House as a worthy civic function, but the award surely must only be a recognition of results of untold numbers of alcoholic recoveries over the years. As Winston Churchill would put it, "of blood, sweat and tears".

We who are currently active in the affairs of the First Step House cannot and will not take any credit for this surprising award. To think that our humble First Step House would place about 3rd or 4th in a total list of over 207 charitable organizations in Orange County, judged thusly by a completely impartial panel of leading citizens, brings home to us with startling impact the responsibility we carry and the esteem of our community for this work.

So we say that this is a time for humility, for understanding, for wisdom. Walt Disney, and Disneyland, and the Committee, we thank you. We are proud you have recognized us and we will try to keep faith with you. But more important we must keep faith with the sick alcoholics and without friends in Alcoholics Anonymous who have made the Step House what it is today and who will continue to support this house if we allow it to grow gently into maturity.
