CHARMING IS THE WORD FOR ALCOHOLICS . . . BY FULTON OWSLER

One of the early admirers of this new flowering Fellowship, and a most articulate one . . . published the following in Liberty Magazine in the mid-1940's. "Old Timers" will remember . . . "Newer Members" will love it too!

Down at the very bottom of the social scale of A.A. society are the pariahs, the untouchables, and the outcasts, all known by one excoriating epithet—relatives.

I am a relative. I know my place. I am not complaining. But I hope no one will mind if I venture the plaintive confession that there are times, oh, many, many times when I wish I had been an alcoholic. By that I mean that I wish I were an A.A. The reason for that is that I consider the A.A. people the most charming in the world.

Such is my considered opinion. As a journalist it has been my fortune to meet many of the people who are considered charming. I number among my friends stars and lesser lights of stage and cinema; writers are my daily diet. I know the ladies and gentlemen of both political parties; I have been entertained in the White House. I have broken bread with kings and ministers and ambassadors and I say after that catalog, which could be extended, that I would prefer an evening with my A.A. friends to any

person or group of persons I have indicated. I ask myself why I consider so charming these alcoholic caterpillars who have found their butterfly wings in Alcoholics Anonymous. There are more reasons than one, but I can name a few.

They are imaginative, and that helps to make them alcoholics. Some of them drank to flog their ambition on to greater efforts. Others guzzled only to black out unendurable demons that rose in their imagination. But when they have found their restoration, their imagination is responsive to new incantations, and their talk abounds with color and light, and that makes them charming companions too.

The A.A. people are what they are, and they were what they were, because they are sensitive, imaginative, possessed of a sense of humor and awareness of universal truth. They are sensitive, which means that they are hurt easily, and that helped them to become alcoholics. But when they have found their restoration, they are still as sensitive as ever; responsive to beauty and to truth and eager about the intangible glories of this life. That makes them charming companions.

They are possessed with a sense of humor. Even in their cups they have been known to say damnable funny things.

OFTEN IT WAS BEING FORCED TO TAKE SERIOUSLY THE LITTLE AND MEAN THINGS OF LIFE that made them seek escape in a bottle. But when they have found their restoration, their sense of humor finds a blessed freedom, and they are able to reach a god-like state where they can laugh at themselves, the very height of self-conquest. Go to the meetings and listen to the laughter. At what are they laughing? At ghoulish memories over which weaker souls would cringe in useless remorse. And that makes them wonderful people to be with by candlelight.

And they are possessed of a sense of universal truth. That is often a new thing in their hearts. The fact that this at-onement with God's universe had never been awakened in them is sometimes the reason why they drank. The fact that it was at last awakened is almost always the reason why they were restored to the good and simple ways of life. Stand with them when the meeting is over, and listen while they say the "Our Father". They have found a Power greater than themselves which they diligently serve. And that gives them a charm that never was elsewhere on land or sea. It makes you know that God, Himself, is really charming, because the A.A. people reflect His mercy and His forgiveness.

HOSPITAL & INSTITUTION

WHAT INSTITUTIONAL WORK IS TO ME.....

I had been on the AA program for three or four months--what I had been receiving must have been reaching me by osmosis. I knew I took my body to a meeting every night and sometimes twice a day. I participated in many meetings but couldn't remember what I said. Jack R. was one of many AA members that drove me daily to AA meetings and to business appointments. Jack invited me to attend an Institutional Committee Business meeting with him. That was a year and a half ago.

I heard the word, action, at that first meeting and I wanted to be involved. The realization that I had been hospitalized many times for acute alcoholism and that I had surrendered myself to AA, the only thing left, in Orange County jail, allowed me to identify and know that I could help other alcoholics in and out of institutions. The then secretary, Johnnie, verbalized one of his strong uninhibited messages and I was around the room asking panel members if I could please go with them. I found I had to wait another three months, but I used that time finding out all I could about institutional work.

When I did become eligible, Jack R. let me share with Norwalk patients. I went again to Norwalk with Bert and then to Long Beach V.A. Hospital with Bert. I shared there and realized that I had not attended an AA meeting the many times I was a patient there. I was instructed to do so by my psychiatrist but couldn't accept that I had a drinking problem. Bert's dedication, then and now, rubbed off and I knew this was a necessary part of my program. I couldn't wait to obtain my first panel.

Jim knew I was anxious and he saw

to it that I did get a panel at Orange Co. Medical Center. I now have two panels there. They are not always successful because of lack of interested patients, but I still have a meeting and come away with some real good, unexplained serenity. I was having a good feeling about what AA was doing in hospitals and prisons.

This good feeling has brought dedication and a two-fold arrest to my two-fold disease.

It has not been necessary for me to miss an institutional meeting over the last 18 months. I see the same dedicated people at each meeting and always receive an outstanding spiritual message from Johnnie.

The accepted fact that I am an alcoholic allows me to accept others without reservation and the beauty of it came to light on two panel trips to Atascadero. One as a panel guest in March and the other as a panel leader in June. I could identify with the incarcerated AA members. But for the Grace of God, it could have happened to me. When drinking, I was guilty of many actions unacceptable to society and who, but God, knows how I operated under black-out conditions. Everywhere I go in and for AA reminds me of "What it used to be like" and that keeps me sober. A most gratifying aspect of the Atascadero trip is the continuous 14 hour AA meeting.

I appreciate this opportunity to thank those who have participated with me on panels, in institutional meetings and in all my affairs. To me, it's a two-way street "giving and taking". The more you give the more you receive and that is action.

In the meantime, we obtained 3 weekly panels in the (then) new Orange County Honor Farm. It was my privilege to take the first meeting into this Honor Farm and to keep this panel for quite a while.

What I am getting at is this work has kept me sober and alive, as this is a sure way to carry the message of A.A. to alcoholics who are confined in Penal Institutions and cannot come to meetings out here as we can.

WE ARE CONVINCED!

There are a number of areas in the Big Book where the Authors were less than demanding and used language that might be referred to as rather mild in tone. Some examples of this might be found in phrases such as "we suggest" and "in our opinion" and "we think". Other examples can be found that illustrate the point as well.

There is one paragraph in the Big Book, however, in Chapter 3, where there is no equivocation, where the language leaves no doubt of the intent of the writers, the argument is to the point and concise, quote,

"We are convinced to a man that alcoholics of our type are in the grip of a progressive illness. Over any considerable period we get worse, never better."

Nothing wishy-washy about that. "We are convinced", (what could be more positive). "To a man", (that means all of us). "We get worse, never better", (sincere and powerful words).

Anytime we hear the newcomer or not so new-comer speak out concerning a strong urge to take a drink of alcohol because things are not going so good we want to shout, "Forget it . . . that is if you are an 'alcoholic of our type'".

Let's put it another way. Suppose there are 40 of us at a meeting and you say that everyone is picking on you and you feel like to hell with it, and you think that you may go out and get drunk.

The leader calls on me and I say that I agree with you. I think you should go out and do some more drinking because you are probably not ready for us and you need to do some more qualifying.

The rest of the group speak up, almost as one, and protest that I don't know what I am talking about, that I am not to be listened to, that my opinion isn't worth a tinker's damn and I am to be ignored forthwith.

Whereupon we tote up the score and find that the Group is united against me, 38 to 1. Who are you going to believe, me- or the rest of the group.

Now substitute yourself for me. Convince yourself that you are not fully qualified for AA and probably made a mistake in coming in the first place since you are not an alcoholic at all. The people in AA are going to tell you the same thing they told me. That your thinking is all mixed up, and that your advice is not to be taken. Who will you believe?

That is what Chapter Three is saying, "We are convinced to a man
