CENTRAL OFFICE HAS FOUND A NEW HOME..

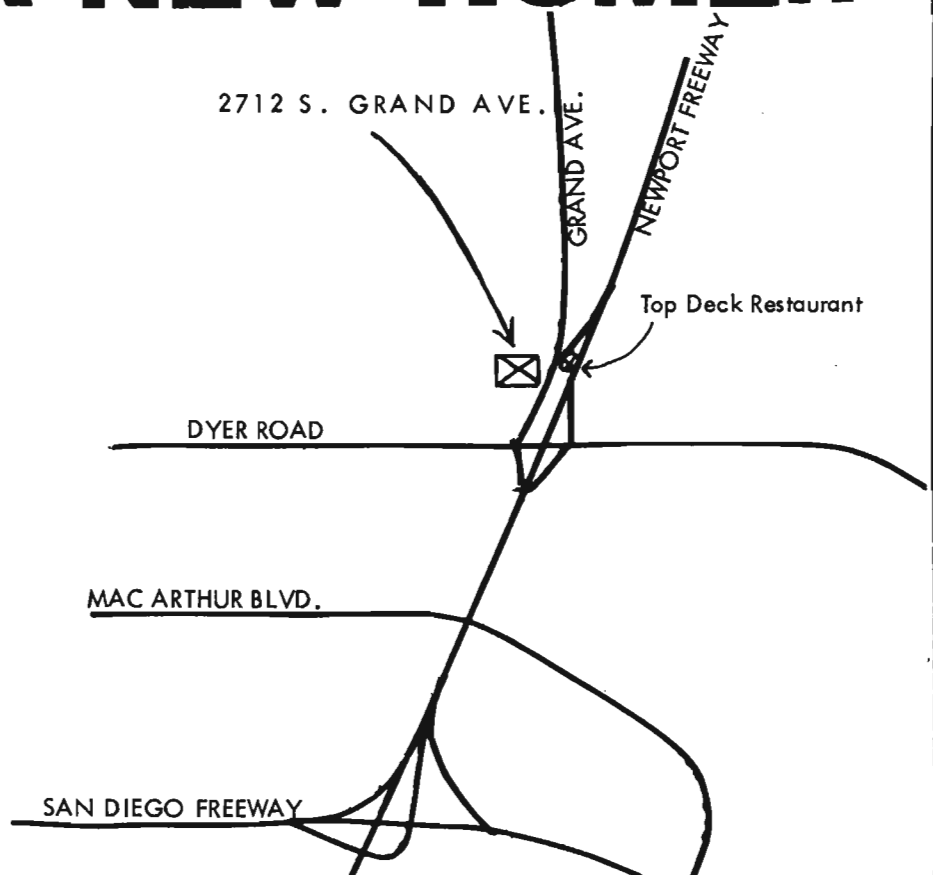
When your wants become your needs it will happen. For several months a lot of time has been spent looking for a new and larger location for our Orange Co. Central Office.

MY NEW LEASE ON LIFE

I want to express my intermost feelings of security I have found in A.A. I'm a "Show-me gal" from St. Joe, Mo., and up until 8 months ago I was a practicing alcoholic back in the midwest with a drinking husband and six children. These six children have been raising me for the past 10 years. Thank God, they never gave up on me, they knew I was sick and treated me as such. My oldest child is 25 and my youngest is 3. (we had a lot of cold long winters in Missouri.)

I've been married three times and each husband was as sick or sicker than myself, no longer is my Higher Power in the opposite sex.

I've been in mental wards and hospitals several times, also tried the easy way out many times. To do away with myself would have been much easier than to stop drinking. I knew I was destroying my entire family and felt they would be better off without me.

In AA I have found acceptance and security which has given me faith and confidence. Here I have found approval and friendship and with approval I have become to like myself. In AA I have become stronger and therefore I am no longer afraid. Through the mistakes of the past I have found AA and a program for living and feel enthusiastic about the future.

I try never to say no to anyone who reaches out and asks for help. Helping others strengthens my own will. I know I have to belong in AA (not to AA) to grow. Only through activity do I keep from becoming stagnant. I realize now that the causes of my drinking run far deeper than self indulgence.

I thank God each night for showing me a way to live comfortably with the help of A.A.

All through life as I passed through doors I kept searching for something I couldn't see. It seemed as though I didn't fit anywhere, I wasn't rich and I was not poor but all my life I couldn't find that proper door until one day I reached the bottom of the stairway with two exits. One sign said, "Drinking beer only". I didn't want that door because it had just led me into my first 502, and the second door read "Easy Does It", One Day at a

Time and Love". So I opened that second door and this is what I saw, heard and received. So you see it is no longer necessary for me to drink or to think about drinking. To prove these are not just empty words, on January 3, 1974 I had two major surgeries at the Pico Rivera Hospital. I've had surgery before, but I can truthfully say from the bottom of my heart I have never been so calm in my life. I had every reason in the book to take a drink. No hospitalization, a surgery I didn't count on. The day I was released from the hospital a woman made a left hand turn in front of my husband on his way home from work and demolished my car. Thank God no injuries were sustained. But with the love of the people and their prayers, and with my life and will turned over to my Higher Power whom I choose to call God, everything will be all right as long as I take it one day at a time.

MEDICAL HOUSE CALLS ?

When you make a 12th Step Call do you talk about medicine or about sobriety? It seems like one of the most common calls I get is from someone on a 12th Step call seeking advice about a wet one who feels he or she is "about to have a convulsion" or insists he can't talk about sobriety until he solves his medical problems.

It happened again the other day when the A.A. member found herself dragging the wet one to different hospitals seeking information the soused one already had. And they both almost missed the entire A.A. meeting until I told her to stop running a taxi service and get to her meeting-alone if necessary. That way at least one of them ended up sober.

My point is, I don't think one needs to know much medicine to make good 12th Step-calls. Any necessary help can usually be obtained by a simple phone call to the patient's regular physician or to any doctor on the program. Nothing, in my opinion, is more important than sobriety and I leave my license at home when I go on a 12th Step call-or to an A.A. meeting. Don't let them distract you as to why you are there, and above all, don't forget Rule 62, *(page 153 in 12 & 12).

COMING SOON



A number of people suggested that communication be the subject of my first "Delegate's Message." Since communication has been, more or less, the theme of my life from the standpoints of heritage, vocation and avocation, I was pleased.

Our lives begin with communication--a baby's first cry--and end in silence with that final sigh. What we are--what we do--and what we become in the interval between depends pretty much on our ability to communicate..by word,by sight, by touch. Parents said,"Now you listen to me!" Teachers said,"Pay attention!"And after that we were on our own.

When I came to A.A. I had lost the desire to communicate; I could not concentrate long enough to listen, nor read; there was nothing left but pain and fear and anger. But God is very patient, tho His Voice is very soft, and in time I "came to believe" and began to understand that the program of Alcoholics Anonymous, on which my life depended, was simply a matter of communication with an open mind...one drunk talking to another. I had only to "sit down, shut up, and listen."

But that was just the beginning.Even- tually, the precious ability to communi- cate restored, I became eager to learn. How do you make a twelfth step call? When should I take an inventory? What are traditions? The answer was always the same: "Read the book!" You see, our Founders and those who came along

with them were expert communicators, but I wasn't listening: I had found my voice and I was talking!

All communication is based on two- way interchange: there has to be a sen- der" and "receiver" and the roles are constantly reversing. If you're speaking and I'm not listening, I'm the loser; if you're writing and I'm not reading,again I'm the loser.Perhaps each of us needs to develop more expertise in communi- cating.

The total program of Alcoholics Anon- ymous is based on communication of what- ever nature, if it is to be perpetuated for those who come after us; but more speci- fically, if we are to achieve the "one- ness" . . . the UNITY on which our person- al recovery depends. Along with recovery comes spiritual growth and, hopefully,an everwidening involvement in carrying the message and a desire to serve. No way can we do this unless we have learned to communicate..to listen and to read and to pass it on. SERVICE is communication! Our goal is attraction.

And so I'm your delegate. . . .not be- cause I have any unique qualifications, but perhaps because I've learned to com- municate. Today I do not ask,"What are the 12 Concepts? What does it mean,A. A. Comes of age? What are the princi- ples of A.A. ?"because I've read the books! But there is still so much I don't know. . or don't remember; and hopefully, with God's help and yours,I shall continue to be a two-way communicator the rest of

my life. Won't you join me? What should we talk about? How can I best serve? What do you want me to take back to New York?

A delegate has an awesome responsi- bility and I feel more humble than I've ever felt that you chose me as your trust- ed servant. But I'm keenly aware of God's Hand in that you chose such capable and dedicated individuals as the other mem- bers of the "team" to serve as officers of the Area Service Committee during the next two years. But the job will not get done without the continued support of and communication from and to the GSRs, Local Committee Members and District Chairmen! And to the chairmen and direc- tors of the Intergroup and Institutional board and committees throughout the Mid Southern California Area. .you have con- tributed significantly to our unification--our common welfare. How may I serve you?

Please accept my gift of love and ser- vice and personal gratitude to each of you for the understanding and help you have so generously given me during the past two years.

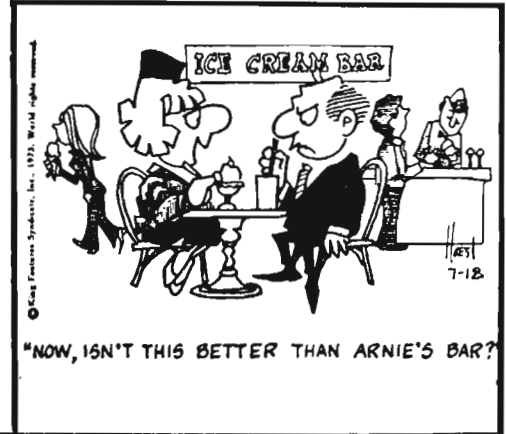
HUMILITY
