"AS WE UNDERSTOOD HIM".....JIM BURWELL

James (Jimmy) Burwell left us Sunday September 8th in San Diego after a long illness.

He was the oldest living member of Alcoholics Anonymous having been one of the first 100 members of this society.

HIS STORY AS PUBLISHED IN GRAPEVINE, MAY, 1968.....

SOBER FOR THIRTY YEARS.....

One of the earliest members of the first New York AA group, he was also its first "self proclaimed atheist"!

As noted in my story, "The Vicious Cycle," in the Big Book, I came into the Fellowship in New York in January, 1938. At that time it was just leaving the Oxford Group. There was one closed discussion meeting a week, at Bill's home in Brooklyn - attendance six or eight men with only three members who had been sober more than one year: Bill, Hank, and Fritz. This is about all that had been accomplished in the four years with the New York Oxford Group.

During those early meetings at Bill's, they were flying blind, with no creed or procedure to guide them, though they did use quite a few of the Oxford sayings and the Oxford Absolutes. Since both Bill and Dr. Bob had had almost-over-night religious experiences, it was taken for granted that all who followed their way would have the same sort of experience. So the early meetings were quite religious, in both New York and Akron. There was always a Bible on hand, and the concept of God was all biblical.

Into this fairly peaceful picture came I, their first self-proclaimed atheist, completely against all religions and conventions. I was the captain of my own ship. (The only trouble was, my ship was completely disabled and rudderless.) So naturally I started fighting nearly all the things Bill and the others stood for, especially religion, the "God bit". But I did want to stay sober, and I did love the understanding Fellowship. So I became quite a problem to that early group, with all my constant haranguing against all the spiritual angles.

All of a sudden, the group became really worried. Here I had stayed sober five whole months while fighting everything the others stood for. I was now number four in "seniority." I found out later they had a prayer meeting on "what to do with Jim." The consensus seemed to have been that they hoped I would either leave town or get drunk.

That prayer must have right on target, for I was suddenly taken drunk on a sales trip. This became the shock and the bottom I needed. At this time I was selling auto polish to jobbers for a company that Bill and Hank were sponsoring, and I was doing pretty well, too. But despite this, I was tired and completely isolated there in Boston. My fellow alcoholics really put the pressure on as I sobered up after four days of no relief, and for the first time I admitted I couldn't stay sober alone. My closed mind opened a bit. Those folks back in New York, the folks who believed, had stayed sober. And I hadn't. Since this episode I don't think I have

ever argued with anyone else's beliefs. Who am I to say?

I finally crawled back to New York and was soon back in the fold. About this time, Bill and Hank were just beginning to write the AA Big Book. I do feel sure my experience was not in vain, for "God" was broadened to cover all types and creeds: "God as we understand Him."

I feel my spiritual growth over these past thirty years has been very gradual and steady. I have no desire to 'graduate' from AA. I try to keep my memories green by staying active in AA - a couple of meetings weekly.

For the new agnostic or atheist just coming in, I will try to give very briefly my milestones in recovery:

1. The first power I found greater than myself was John Barleycorn.
 2. The AA Fellowship became my higher power for the first two years.
 3. Gradually, I came to believe that God and Good were synonymous and were to be found in all of us.
 4. And I found that by meditating and trying to tune in on my better self for guidance and answers, I became more comfortable and steady.

FRESH FOR RELAYING EXPERIENCE -STRENGTH & HOPE

The regular meeting of F.R.E.S.H. was held Aug. 29th at Central Office with Les E. acting as moderator.

In his 15 years of sobriety Les has been extremely active in all phases of AA service. His experiences, serving as secretary of many groups over the years, has given him a wealth of valuable experiences which he shared with us. In his own words he explains his thoughts on the subject:

"Very personal views of the moderator, presented as suggestions only to new or soon to be Secretaries."

1. Start and end meetings on schedule, now that we're sober let's show the beginners that we can tell time.
2. Keep secretaries report following the meeting short and to the point. Announcements of meeting that are listed in the directory should not be encouraged.
3. If at all possible, do not talk from podium or make announcements to the group. (Try this experimentally, the take will be improved) While the baskets are being passed.

4. Plan to give a detailed financial report to the group once a month. Work toward a distribution of money after group's expenses have been met of six parts to central office, three parts to G. S. O., New York, and one part to local service assembly.
5. Maintain an ample supply of Conference Approved literature and books.
6. Establish a time once a month for a brief report from your G.S.R. and your G.R. three to five minutes should be adequate.
7. Try to lead discussion meetings to subjects germane to AA recovery. Problems related to hospital procedure, court actions, apartment rents and living conditions should be discouraged.

There are many things that time and experience have proven to be good. Most of these are common judgement and time will help the trusted servants to become aware of them. Remember, those who contribute the most receive the most, you cannot outgive God.

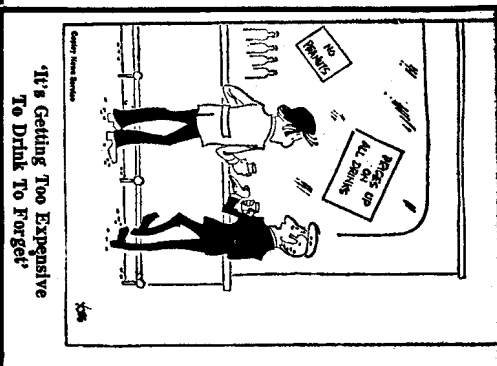

SPEAKING AT NON-AA GROUPS...

Many members of the fellowship probably aren't familiar with the increasing popularity of A.A. speakers for non-AA groups.

During the past school year AA speakers talked to approximately 8000 students, Junior High through College in Orange County.

In addition speakers were sent to service clubs and other groups such as Remarriage Inc., and the Braille Institute's young adults.

The rewards are great for the members of the fellowship who have the time during the work week to communicate with the general public.

Reaction to the talks varies from - "How can I get my mother (father, daughter, son) to quit drinking?" to "Do you think I'm an alky?" One little girl aged

13, asked, "If I drink five fifths of wine a weekend, am I an alky?" When asked about the rest of the week, she exclaimed, "Oh! I never drink on school nights!"

The acceptance of our speakers can be seen in a couple of examples. This alky spoke to all the 8th graders at a small K-8 school. When they were asked what kind of a speaker they would like at their graduation ceremony, they asked if they could have that AA guy back.

Another thing that happened often is having off duty teachers and event teachers bringing their whole class in to hear our speakers, that weren't originally scheduled to hear the talk.

Anyone who would like to help carry our message to the general public can leave their names with the central office. One year of sobriety is preferred.

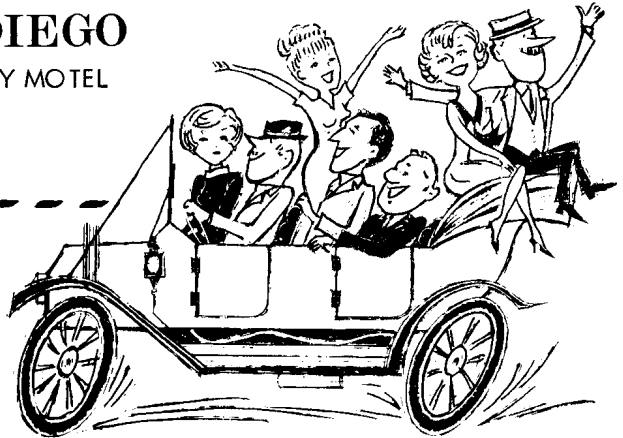

WILL YOUR GROUP'S FACE BE RED?
It probably will if your Group is omitted from the regional section of the new **WORLD DIRECTORY** covering the Western United States, on which the General Service Office will begin compiling before the end of this year.

It is the responsibility of your Group's General Service Representative (nominally referred to as G.S.R.) to supply group information that is up-to-date for inclusion in the World Directory. Did I hear you say your group doesn't have a G.S.R.? Then it is your responsibility to find out why. . . assuming that you live by the principle. . . 'when anyone, anywhere reaches out for help, I want the hand of A. A. always to be there. And for that I am responsible' . . .

Meanwhile. . . pending the election of the group's G.S.R. . . . it is the immediate responsibility of the group's secretary to supply up-to-date information regarding the exact name of the group; names, addresses and phone numbers of group officers or active long-time members who are willing to be listed as group contacts in the Directory; location, city, day of the week and hour at which the group meets; and the approximate number of group members. And this is not just a "one-shot" deal. Wherever there is a change in any of the above-mentioned data, the new information should be sent in. . . as promptly as possible.

Where do you send this information? If you have a group G.S.R., he or she will know that it should be sent to the District Committee Chairman or Local Committee Member of the district in

which your group is located. If not, then it should be sent to the Delegate, P.O. Box 3134, Torrance, California 90510. . . or to the Mid-Southern California Area, P.O. Box 6222, Long Beach, California 90806.

Some of you may recall that in the past the General Service Office in New York has sent a "Group Information Card" to each group of record, usually in late October or November, with a request that it be returned by a specific deadline. Now all of that has changed. At the 1974 General Service Conference it was decided that the format of the World Directory would be changed and that the Delegate for each Area would be responsible for furnishing accurate information for future directories. This means that the old, outdated information that has been carried from one directory to the next when a group failed to respond to G.S.O.'s request, will in the future be dropped from the directory.

Only A.A. groups will be listed. . . . not meetings. What constitutes an A.A. group? Official A.A. literature tells us: "Traditionally, any two or more alcoholics meeting together for the purposes of sobriety may consider themselves an AA group; provided that, as a Group, they are self-supporting and have no outside affiliation. Groups listed in the directory are listed at their own request. . . ." The only change is that now the "request" should go through the Delegate and/or the District Committee of which your group's G.S.R. is a member.

Just one more word while we are on the subject of General Service Represent-

atives: The term of office of a G.S.R. is normally two years and he or she is the recipient of all mailings sent by the General Service Office for your group. This includes the bi-monthly publication "Box 4-5-9"--World Directory (subsequently will be the Regional Directory for the Western United States)--and for new groups, a "Group Handbook" and a free package of Conference-approved literature. In addition, the G.S.R. attends monthly meetings of the District Service Committee and the Area General Service Assemblies which are held quarterly. Also, the G.S.R. is logically a member of your group's Steering Committee. . . or if the group does not have one, he or she would certainly urge and assist in the mechanics of electing such a committee. And there are many more ways in which the G.S.R. helps the group to function effectively in its responsibility to A.A.'s future.

From the above it becomes obvious that the G.S.R. is a knowledgeable fellow or gal with two or three years (suggested) of sobriety and a real desire to serve the Fellowship. Also, it's not a bad idea to keep in mind that if your group nominates and elects you to the job of G.S.R. it is doing you great honor. . . it is indicating its confidence in your capacity and ability to eventually become district committee chairman-Area officer-delegate- or trustee of the General Service Board. Almost without exception, the alcoholics serving in those capacities have begun their service activities as G.S.R.s. Please think about that.

DIGEST OF MINUTES OF THE SEPTEMBER 8, 1974 SPECIAL GENERAL SERVICE ASSEMBLY.

TOTAL ATTENDANCE: 82

The 1974-75 Area Service Committee and General Assembly of the Mid-Southern California Area will never be described in the annals of history as a do-nothing, apathetic bunch of recovering alcoholics! We don't always agree, thank God, but we do make some action. As our Past-delegate, Ellery S., said just before adjournment, the most significant result of our discussions on the subject of court referrals was that, with very few exceptions, our District Committees met and held in-depth discussions regarding the proposed letter to the courts which resulted in the "voice of group conscience" being heard loud and clear.

. . . some pro and some con. . . and this is the way it should be.

Preceding the vote on the suggested letter, each District Committee Chairman, the Intergroup Board Chairmen and Institutional Committee Directors were given an opportunity to present the consensus of their groups. Voting was by a show of hands, 45 voting in favor of sending the proposed letter to presiding court judges in this Area, and 23 opposed.

The "Proposed Memorandum" which was suggested to accompany the letter presented the kind of information it was felt should be conveyed to the probationers by the court (or by the probation offi-

cers) following the court hearing. By unanimous vote it was agreed that the original proposed memorandum was too long and involved. Two alternative memoranda were presented but no majority agreement could be reached. It was recommended that the paragraph in reference to a " Proposed Memorandum" be deleted from the letter to the courts (4th paragraph, page 2) and only the 4 pieces of Conference-approved literature would be enclosed to which reference had been made in the letter. The Assembly voted in favor of the motion to accept this commendation.

On the subject of "Area officers" travel expenses," upon the recommendation of the District Committee Chairman who had initially raised the question, it was voted to make no changes in the previously approved policy. However, recalling years past when the Area's treasury was zilch, caution in all expenditures was recommended.

Alternate Delegate Stu N. had been requested by the Subcommittee on Area Service Structure to submit recommendations for a chairman and vice-chairman for the Area Public Information Committee. He presented Lionel J. for chairman and Odene S. for vice-chairman, both of whom had indicated their willingness to serve, and there was unanimous Assembly approval.

Stu had also been asked to investigate the feasibility and need for a Committee on Cooperation with the Professional Community and recommended that such a committee is needed to work in collaboration with the Public Information Committees. There was general agreement on this recommendation and until such time as a qualified C.P.C. chairman is selected, it will be handled by Lionel and Odene.

Treasurer Goldene L. gave a brief explanation regarding the Procedure for

supplying group information for the World Directory." The DCCs and LCMs were urged to proceed without delay in preparing their district roster in the recommended format and copies sent to the Delegate and the Area Directory Chairman. It was also emphasized that a tremendous amount of work is involved. . . that it is an ongoing project which will require that all changes as well as new groups be reported promptly. . . and the Delegate will ask for volunteers to help type up the new group information cards as soon as they are received from G.S.O.

Goldene distributed to all DCCs and LCMs a packet of data that has been prepared as a brief orientation for new GSRs . . . somewhat in the nature of a guideline applicable specifically to our Area. Her covering letter is self-explanatory and approval will be requested at our next General Assembly on October 20 in Fontana.

Bruce G., Chairman for the next SERVATHON, announced it will be held Saturday, November 2, at the Garden Grove Alano Club, 9636 Garden Grove Blvd. He has prepared a topical outline and asked for volunteers to serve on the committee.

Denver C., Chairman, announced the date of the 1975 Symposium of Service will be February 1. It will be held at the Grand Hotel in Anaheim where the facilities have been checked out and

are ideally suited for this event. Jack G. will serve as treasurer and the Committee is now requesting the previously approved \$400 advance from the Area treasurer.

Our next General Assembly on October 20 is one you will not want to miss because Cora Louise B., Conference Secretary from the General Service Office, will be our guest. It will be at 1:30 P.M., United Steelworkers Hall, 9460 S. Sierra in Fontana. Take the Sierra offramp from the San Bernardino Freeway. . . Genevieve L., Delegate.

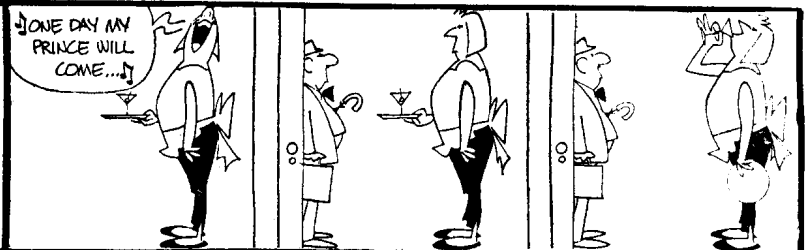

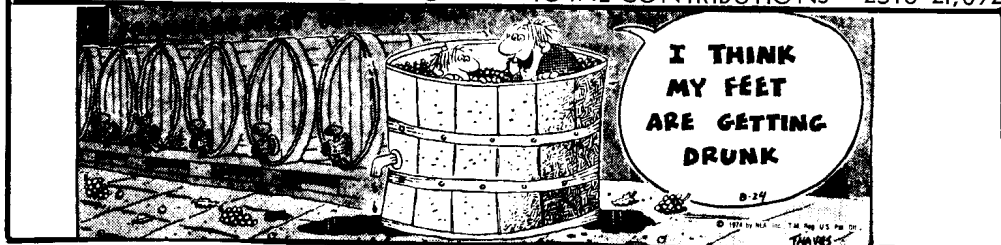
