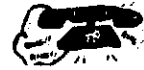

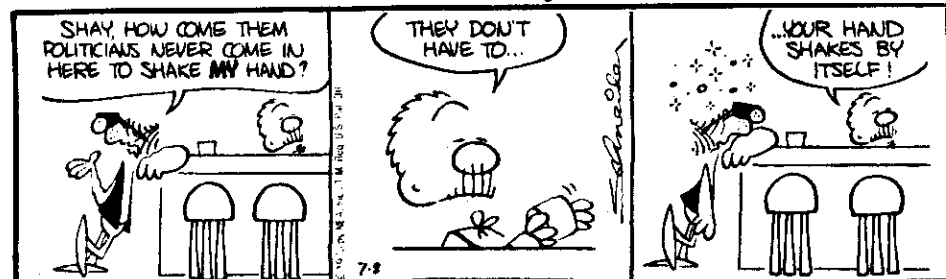

SHARING

EXPERIENCE - STRENGTH - AND HOPE ---

A.P.A. ALL PROBLEMS ANONYMOUS

"Shoemaker, stick to thy last" . . . better do one thing supremely well than many badly. That is the central theme of this tradition. Around it our society gathers in unity. The very life of our Fellowship requires the preservation of this principle.

This is the first paragraph in the chapter on Tradition Five, "Each group has but one primary purpose- to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers.;" as it appears in our book , 12 Steps and 12 Traditions."

It doesn't say, "one of the purposes" or, "a purpose" ,or, "to carry its message to alcoholics, pill-heads, addicts, smokers, coffee drinkers, those with problems of hangnails, hernias, heroin, homosexuality, hemorrhoids, etc." The key words are, "one primary purpose" and "carry its message to the alcoholic."

In 1971, I had been medically evacuated from an island in the Pacific to a Naval Hospital in Japan on orders from the Commandant of the Marine Corps that stated determination was to be made by medical authorities as to my fitness for retention. I needed a little more than 1 1/2 years to complete the 20 years required for retirement. This meant that if I was declared to be unfit for duty, I would be administratively dismissed from the Marine Corps without retirement pay or any other benefits. Having already been divorced, paying child support for four children, bills, etc., this grave threat really got my attention. Although I disavowed any belief that alcoholism was my problem, I stopped drinking immediately. Fortunately, I was under hospital care, so I survived the first month. (I now understand that death can and does occur from alcoholic withdrawal, but there is not one documented case of death as a result of withdrawal from other drugs.)— I was then diagnosed for (1) Chronic Alcoholism, and (2) Alcoholic Hepatic Cirrhosis, Early, Liver, and declared to be unfit for duty. Some other minor complications were that I had malnutrition, jaundice, and was told I had less than 12 months to live. (I weighed 148 lbs. and am 6 feet 3 inches tall.)

I was again medically evacuated, this time to the Navy Alcoholism Rehabilitation Clinic (ARC) in Long Beach,

California. There I was forced to attend AA meetings I continued not drinking, only from the fear of being terminated from the USMC and not because I thought I was alcoholic. This teeth-clenching dryness from alcohol lasted another month throughout about 30 AA meetings with my gut level feeling that alcoholism was not my problem, but I'd play their game. I could not identify with any of the members of the fellowship of AA who freely shared their alcoholic experiences with me. Finally, my defenses totally collapsed and I bought Step One completely—admittance and acceptance that I was indeed an alcoholic. I am convinced that without the ARC I would never have found AA, and equally convinced that without AA I could have been to a thousand clinics and not gained sobriety.

Thank God that my life was saved by alcoholics who shared their alcoholic experiences, strength, and hopes with me—the alcoholic who still suffered. Had I heard DRUGALOGS instead of DRUNKALOGS, I would have been dead by now. Sure, I heard other related disorders from AA members including pills and other drugs, but the primary, number one common denominator was alcoholism. I have not had a drink since. As a secondary benefit, I was returned to duty, completed my time, retired honorably with full benefits and was restored to my highest rank held, Captain.

Today it seems all too frequently I hear individuals say, "I'm Joe, an addict and an alcoholic, or a pillhead and an alcoholic, or a homosexual and an alcoholic. Often I hear a secretary of a meeting, when presenting a cake for 365 days of sobriety, place a whole assortment of conditions other than not drinking on the recipient, such as, "also has not smoked any funny cigarettes, sniffed, shot-up, taken pills, . . . and on and on". It would

not surprise me to hear additional conditions, such as — the ten commandments sexual purity, gambling, coffee-drinking, etc., added. There are times when I wonder whether I am attending a meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous or Narcotics Anonymous!

I don't believe a person can remain sober from alcohol in or out of the program of AA and take non-prescribed drugs for the purpose of mind alteration, so I most certainly do not condone the use of anything for that purpose. However I have seen no references to other drugs, addictions, or afflictions competing with alcoholism as the purpose of our text, "Alcoholics Anonymous".

I do believe that one of the reasons AA has been the salvation of more alcoholics than all the other treatments combined in the history of mankind, is the rifle shot approach to the specific mission of helping alcoholics, rather than the shotgun method of trying to solve all the ailments of society.

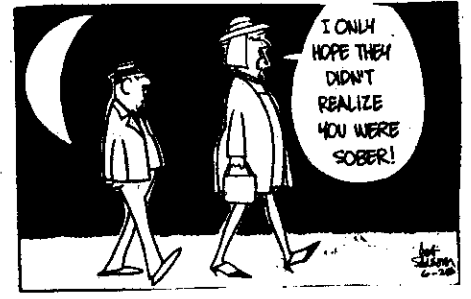
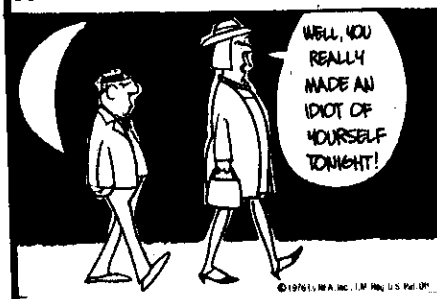
As stated by Bill W. in his article entitled, "Problems Other Than Alcohol" (February 1958), our first duty, as a society, is to insure our own survival. Therefore we have to avoid distractions and multipurpose activity. An AA group as such, cannot take on ALL the personal problems of its members, let alone the problems of the whole world.

Sobriety — freedom from alcohol — through the teaching and practice of the Twelve Steps is the sole purpose of an AA group".

Bill W. further states, "AA members who are so inclined should be encouraged to band together in groups to deal with sedative and drug problems, but they ought to refrain from calling themselves AA groups."

SHARING

ON SPONSORSHIP.....

The lifelong feelings and the intermittent, although increasing series of incidents which finally brought me to Alcoholics Anonymous were "unsponsored."

No one had at any previous point in time handed me a precise guide to embarrassing moments, a blueprint for anxiety, or a map for madness.

Not one person or philosophy book had said, "Here's how you do it: you

take egomania, you take omiscience, you take pride, you take self-sufficiency and you are on your way".

No one counseled: "If people, places and things seem to stand in your way and if feelings of inadequacy, irritability and frustration fill you with a sense of disease, just add good Scotch or cheap Tokay, cold beer or hot ginr, and you will seemingly be able to keep it all together and proceed.

No one told me these things. If they had I might have done the opposite, for such has been the perversity of my nature. I realize in retrospect that I lived much of my life as an act of defiance. I pursued my own way for so long and with such dedication that I eventually ended up doing many things I didn't plan, didn't enjoy and didn't endorse afterward, even though I was trying, at the same time, to live up to my personal, professional and civic responsibilities.

Throughout the years, I steadfastly had vowed always to cherish and protect. The Book calls it "Self-Will Run Riot".

For a long time alcohol seemed to solve my life. When it stopped working for me, but wouldn't let go of me, I knew desperation. Finally, when the psychic pain of drinking became worse than the pain from which I was trying to escape, I came to Alcoholics Anonymous.

Thankfully, for the first time in my life, I became willing to listen, to keep an open mind, to entertain suggestions, even to follow direction. In these five-plus years of sobriety, I have become increasingly more willing to do these things, for I have found that the more I do them, the better I feel.

I have not yet ceased "fighting everybody", but it seems that if I place first things first and keep my defended my "rights", including my right to drink. I defended my "way" through a number of hospital visits (for "nerves"), car wrecks, jail "inspections", shattered relationships, threatened jobs, and the look in the eyes of two children whom I

DELEGATE'S MESSAGE

The 1976 Conference Committee on Finance recommended that the General Service Board and A.A. World Service Board of Directors consider reducing the net income from the sales of literature by appropriate means, such as (a) a reduction in the price of the Big Book, (b) Liberalizing the discount structure, (c) the distribution of gratis or low cost literature to P.I. Committees, Institutional Committees or new Groups.

Delegates should emphasize that this recommendation is made in anticipation of increased Group Participation and that further efforts to control literature costs to the fellowship, the Conference Structure, and A.A. unity depends upon a solid base of GROUP SUPPORT.

What does all this mean? Well first, our 7th Tradition of self support and our 7th Concept, the effectiveness of the power of the purse are involved. I do not believe group contributions have ever completely supported the services vital to the new members. Our fellowship has always been dependent upon literature sales and other means of income to stay in the black.

So how can I encourage the membership to continue to support the services and attempt to encourage groups and meetings where support is non-ex-

istent to assume their responsibility? As I reflected upon this, I thought of my groups' increasing financial obligations, room rent is going up, literature costs more, coffee has doubled in cost, everything pertaining to my groups' expenses is higher. I have almost always put \$1.00 in the basket at my home group since 1960, this is 1976, I still put my \$1.00 in the basket. The group that I now belong to, membership is approximately the same size as the group that I began in, in 1960. We still ask new members not to contribute, we have a few retired members on limited incomes, and we certainly don't expect them to be burdened with the financial responsibility of our fellowship. My personal income has increased, so has inflation. In any event I have doubled my contribution to my home group weekly.

\$10.00 per member per year would more than cover all of our service needs. \$6.00 to our Central Office, \$3.00 to General Service and \$1.00 to the Mid-So. Calif. Area. Are your group members able to meet these responsibilities, or are other members paying your way? Does your group meet those responsibilities or are other groups paying your way? Some groups are just barely able to meet their own expenses, unable to send contributions and that does not make them a bad group, that's okay, that's just the

way it is. This fits into our Legacy of Unity. Possibly if we inventory ourselves, then our groups financial structure we can effect enough change to comply with our Traditions and Concepts of Self Support.

The contributions per capita in California to the General Service Office has averaged \$1.35 per member in the last two years. The reported membership has doubled from 32,000 in 1971 to 62,000 in 1976. These figures indicate about one half of our groups and members support the services and the other half do not. I believe we could change this by two methods; first a more accurate count of our group members. If group secretaries or G.S.R.s could poll their groups for a one month period, asking the membership to count themselves ONCE in the group that they feel is their HOME GROUP and not to be counted in any of the other groups that they may attend. It is quite possible this may make a significant difference on the Group Information Cards that are sent into G.S.O. each year. Secondly, if each of us would take a little more interest into our group financial structure and those that can, increase their contributions to their HOME GROUPS.

I do believe that "I am responsible", and "It does begin with ME."

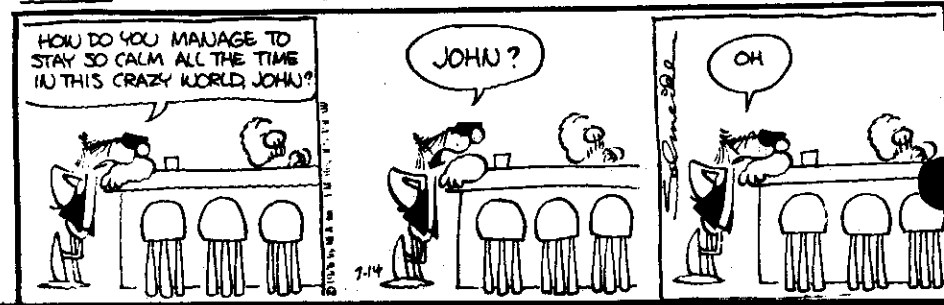

One of the simplest ways for me to keep my program and myself in order is by taking advantage of the benefits of sponsorship

Utilizing a sponsor does several things for me: it provides me with a teacher who has already pioneered the path I now walk and whose counsel can help make my growth in sobriety more rapid and less painful. It gives me a personal mentor, who, by sharing his or her experience, imparts sound direction on days when I am unable to be objective about my own decisions., and transmits strength and hope on days when I suddenly feel that the program will work for everyone but me.

I am grateful to my own sponsor, Clancy I., for so many things and, in the educational area, I think one of the most valuable things I have learned from him is that it isn't too important how I feel about things as long as I take right actions. I used to feel guilty because I was not eager to answer AA requests. Clancy has taught me that if I do what I'm supposed to do, the motives get purified somewhere along the way. Not only has this relieved me from the pressure of my old idea, but I find I am continually more willing, even eager to share, to pass on to the people I sponsor and others some of what has been given to me. It is a joyous continuum of the magic AA circle.

Each time I follow a direction--- whether or not I feel like it---I am af-

firming that I will go to any lengths to protect my sobriety. This adds to myself-respect, makes me like myself more. It also serves to get me out of the way so my Higher Power can work His wonders in my life. These wonders are the fulfillment, on a daily basis, of the AA promises.

My own best judgement, my "unsponsored" actions nearly destroyed me. I believe that following the direction of a sponsor whose integrity I respect totally will help keep me "safe, sane and sober", as Clancy says, and will assist me in achieving my desire to be ever more a part of this beautiful way of life called Alcoholics Anonymous.
