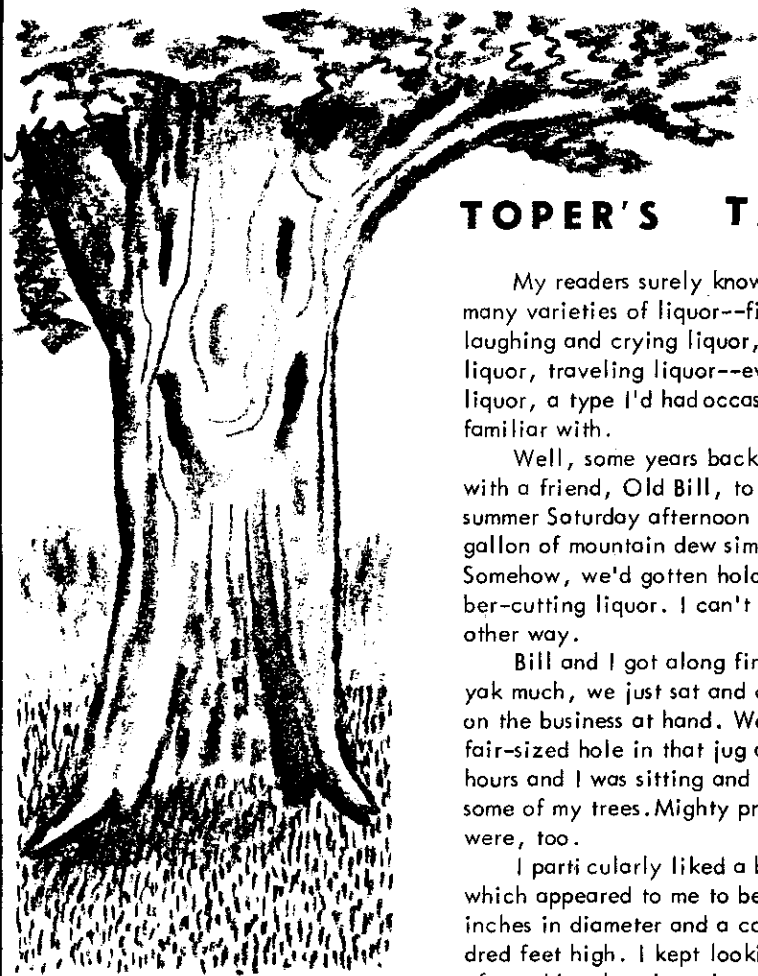

## TROUBLE WITH THE FOURTH?

How often have you heard this phrase? "I just can't write my Fourth Step. It's just too difficult for me." That statement disturbs me. Sure the Fourth is a difficult undertaking, but why must we blow it out of proportion? Yes, blow it out of proportion. My guidance on this question has always been page 64 of the 12 & 12, where the first line of the Sixth Step states, "This is the step that separates the men from the boys..." To me, this means that Step Six is such a difficult undertaking that it begins with a warning not found with any of the other steps in the 12 & 12. Therefore, why should Step Four be so difficult when Our collective experience tells us that Step Six is the "Separation Step?" I believe that the answer to this question is simple. We try to do too much too fast and refuse to follow directions.

On my first attempt and with little "sober reflection", I tried to do Step Four so if it were Steps Four through None combined. Darn it, I wanted it all and I wanted it all right now! "Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves." Seems a simple, but tedious task to me. What is there to fear? We don't even have to share it until Step Five.

Back to Step Six, the one I love the most with the exception of the first half of Step One. To my dismay, I glossed over this step and didn't even read about it prior to attempting Steps One through Five. To me, Step Six says pause, reflect, review, examine, feel. What does this mean to me? First, my defects of character were defined in the preceding steps. Step Six tells me that I must collect and evaluate the data generated in the previous steps in order that I may place myself in that particular state of grace re-

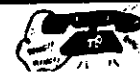
quired for conscious contact with God as is required by Step Seven. I even "hurt" a little during these reflections. However I wanted to become "entirely ready". Therefore, why did I try so hard to pause, reflect, review, examine and evaluate when first attempting Step Four? Ahead of myself again.

Why can't we simply follow directions and do Step Four? Why can't we simply take an inventory of the conduct and feelings of that other self that used to drink? Why? Because we refuse to understand that the steps are to be taken in order and preferably we should read them all before "moving out" in order to see the pattern intended. Again--read all the steps before proceeding beyond the first half of Step One. Ask older members how they did it. Go to step meetings. Do it AA's way, not your way... A Book Baby

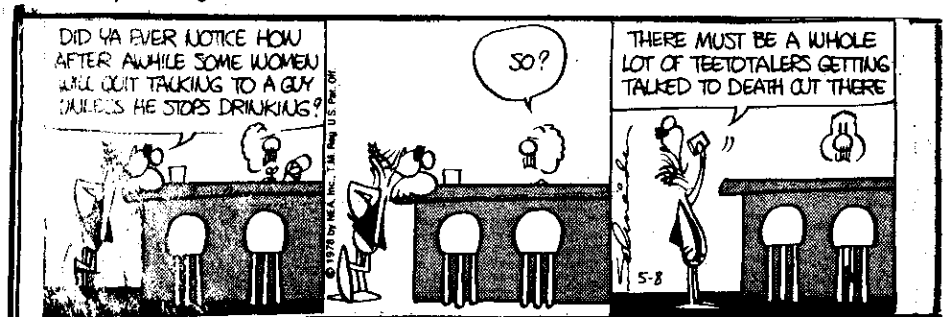

Johnny was the right person in the right place at the right time. He was loved by many. He will be missed.

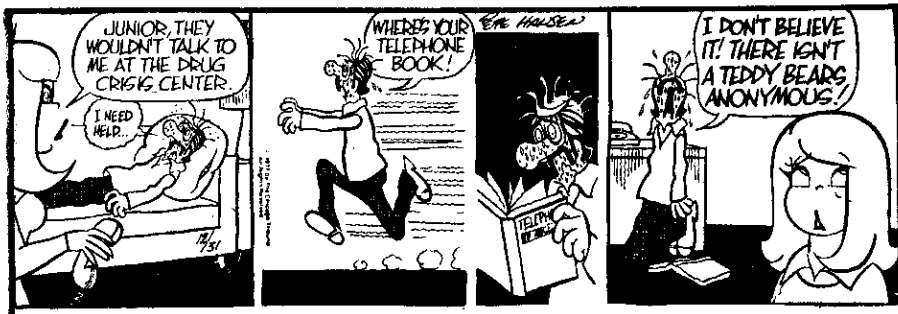

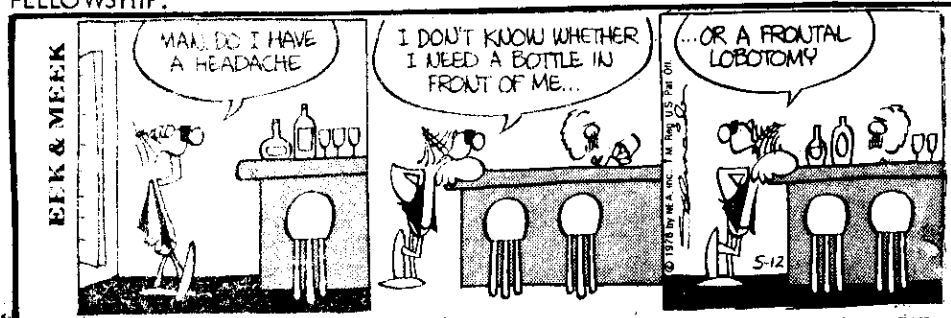

For several years now I have watched our Delegates coming back from the yearly General Service Conference in New York. There has always seemed to be some kind of indefinable change that takes place while they are at the Conference.

I had read our literature many, many times advising just how the affairs of the A.A. Fellowship resides within the group conscience of each and every group. I have known this intellectually for a long time, but experiencing the General Service Conference this past April has moved this fact from my head to a knowing and feeling level and this must be the same feeling the other Delegates have experienced.

My gratitude for the opportunity of representing the Mid-Southern California Area at the Conference cannot be expressed by mere words. I also want to thank those of you who cared enough to express your feelings to me before I left for the Conference. Your comments and ideas were very helpful.

However, my concern over the large number of groups who are not taking part in the Conference structure has certainly grown since the Conference. In my opinion, it is more than a responsibility. It is a privilege that has been given to us by our two co-founders, Dr. Bob and Bill W. Many of our members are of the opinion that "we don't need all that organization". I would like to quote from a talk given by the late Bernard Smith who served as our Chairman of the General Service Board during the time our Conference plan was put together. ( You can find it on page 281 of "A.A. Comes of Age.")

"We may not need a General Service Conference to insure our own recovery. But we do need it to insure the recovery of the alcoholic who still stumbles in the darkness, seeking the light. We need it to insure the recovery of some newborn child, inexplicably destined to alcoholism. We need it to provide, in keeping with the Twelfth Step, a permanent haven for all alcoholics who in the ages ahead can find in A.A. that rebirth which brought its members back to life.

We need it because we are conscious of the devastating effect of the human urge for power and prestige which must never be permitted to invade A.A. We need the Conference to insure A.A. against government while insulating it against anarchy; we need it to protect the fellowship against disintegration while preventing overintegration. We need it so that Alcoholics Anonymous and Alcoholics Anonymous alone may be the ultimate repository of its Twelve Steps, its Twelve Traditions, and all of its services.

We need a Conference to insure that changes within A.A. come only as a response to the needs and wants of all A.A., and not of any few. We need it to insure that the doors of the halls of A.A. shall never have locks on them, so that all people with an alcoholic problem for all time to come may enter these halls unmasked and feel welcome. We need it to help insure that Alcoholics Anonymous never asks of anyone who needs help what his or her race is, what his or her creed is, or what his or her social position is."

Let's hope that many more groups will be sharing in this privilege before the 1979 Conference.

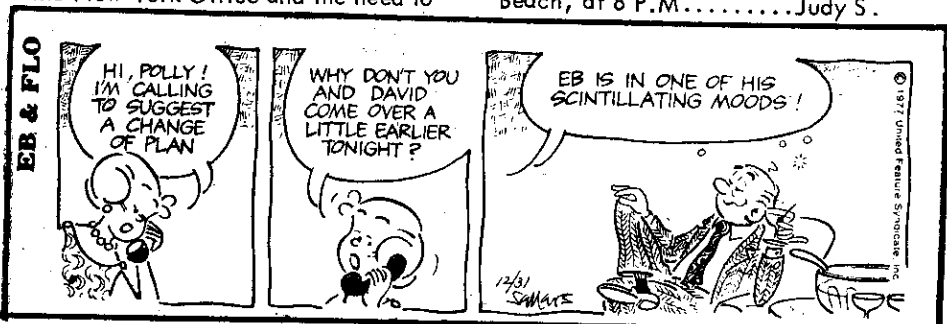

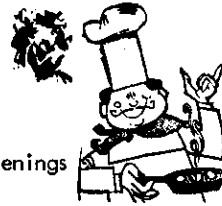

Again, thanks for making my time bearable.

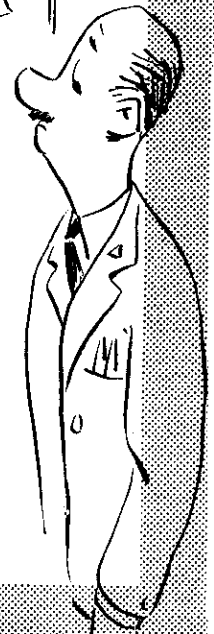

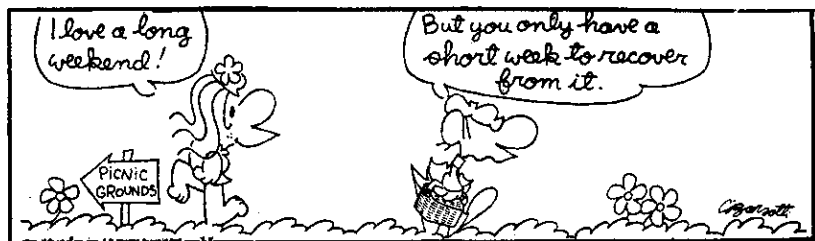
