# The Medical Forum

## COULD YOU BE IN DANGER?

As stressed in the opening essay of this issue, the key to a successful solution for a drinking problem is a willingness to admit to being an alcoholic. The following questions (reprinted with permission from Ayerst Laboratories) are recommended as a means of "self-testing" for a drinking problem.

### EARLY SYMPTOMS: (the first stage of alcoholism)

Yes No

- Are you beginning to lie or feel guilty about your drinking?
- Do you gulp your drinks?
- Do you try to have a few extra drinks before joining others in drinking?
- Must you drink at certain times — for example, before lunch or a special event; after a disappointment or quarrel?
- Do you drink because you feel tired, depressed, or worried?
- Are you annoyed when family or friends talk about your drinking?
- Are you beginning to have memory blackouts and occasional passouts?

### MIDDLE SYMPTOMS: (an extension of early symptoms)

- Are you making more promises and telling more lies about your drinking?
- Are there more times when you need a drink?
- When sober, do you regret what you have said or done while drinking?
- Are you drinking more often alone, avoiding family or close friends?
- Do you have weekend drinking bouts and Monday hangovers?
- Have you been going "on the wagon" to control your drinking?
- Are memory blackouts and passouts becoming more frequent?

### LATE SYMPTOMS: (the advanced stage of alcoholism)

- Do you drink to live and live to drink?
- Are you obviously drunk on important occasions — for example, a special dinner or meeting?
- Do your drinking bouts last for several days at a time?
- Do you sometimes get the "shakes" in the morning and think it helps to take a "quick one"?
- Do blackouts and passouts now happen very often?
- Have you lost concern for your family and others around you?

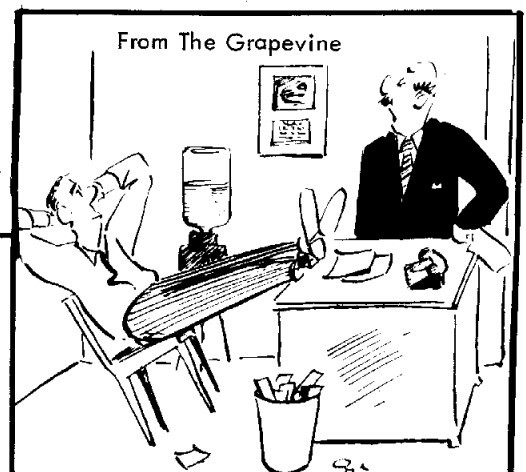

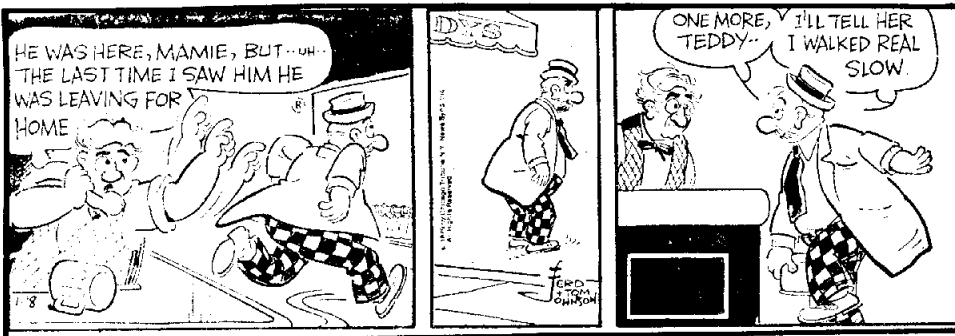

## MESSAGE FROM YOUR DELEGATE.....

The General Service Conference Questionnaires are being returned much better this year than last, and I want to thank you for your interest. Next month I will try to share the outcome of the questionnaires with you.

One of the questionnaires came in from a lone member in Taiwan which was quite a surprise. He said, "I have no delegate but want to have a voice in Alcoholics Anonymous." He certainly does have a voice in A.A. affairs as each and everyone of us has. He related in his letter about the great difficulty he has had the past year after changing his mailing address in receiving his mail from G.S.O. I could really feel empathy for him staying sober with no group or A.A. contacts except through the mail he received. It certainly made me realize how grateful I should be living in an area where A.A. is so accessible.

There are many A.A. members who do not have benefit of belonging to an A.A. group because of location or physical impairments. They are completely dependent upon the mail for contact with another A.A. member. These members are known as Loners and are registered as such at G.S.O. If you like to write letters and would be willing to carry the A.A. message to Loners via correspondence, you can become a Loner Sponsor by advising Helen T., Staff Member at G.S.O., of your desire. There are also many Loners listed in the World Directory for those who are interested. What a wonderful opportunity this could be to practice the 12th Step.

Nineteen members of the Mid-Southern California Area attended the Pacific Region A.A. Service Assembly early in March in Sparks, Nevada. It was another wonderful weekend of sharing and learning about Alcoholics Anonymous. Nearly 500 A.A. members from the eight Western States gathered to share the experience, strength and hope of their particular area. Methods of carrying the message from Alaska might be quite different than Mid-Southern California Area but the dedication of the A.A. members in helping the suffering alcoholic seems to be the same all over. One of the respondents to the Conference Questionnaire may have explained the feeling we seem to experience after attending the Pacific Region Assembly. She had just finished reading "A.A. Comes of Age" and commented, "With this knowledge, I feel more a part of the A.A. Fellowship."

The purpose of the Pacific Region A.A. 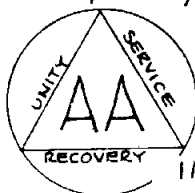

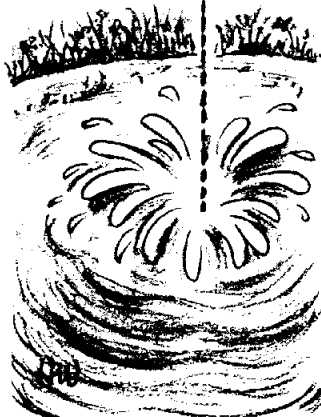
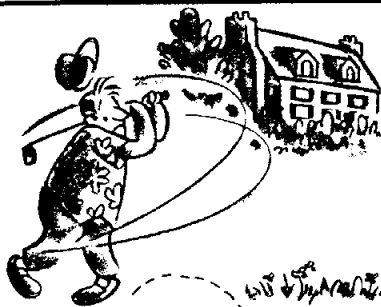

## Over the Nineteenth Hole Under Par

Gone were the good old days when I could stay out all night drinking up a storm, take a cold shower by the dawn's early light, and then sally to the first tee to carve a 250 yard drive down the middle of the fairway.

Gone was the false relief which a couple of beers would provide to offset the shaky putting stroke that followed in the wake of those "high-blended" nights before many tough golf matches.

Gone, too was the fun and relaxation true golf provides true golfers. Years of persistent drinking had undermined any ability I possessed to play well, to focus a mind free of fears and guilts upon keen competition, or to care whether I played well or not.

Despite any earstwhile prowess on the tees and greens, the adverse effects of alcohol rendered me the unwanted member of any foursome. Standing around the first tee trying to find a game when you were fourtime club champion was an unreconcilable affront to my sick ego. My only out was to become the unofficial host to new members who did not know the scoop and hope that my former cronies would not fill them in.

Just when, in the progression of this illness, I lost my "amateur standing" as a normal country club social drinker is frankly unimportant. All I know is that I progressed from a swinging golfer into a swinging drunk-my amateur standing never to be reinstated.

Thanks to God and AA, I have found emancipation from this poison which had become the nemesis not only of my golf game but more important, of my self-respect and the happiness and harmony of my family. I was bankrupt in nearly every area of my being--but this tale is one of a player about to hit it "out of bounds" for keeps, and how he makes a "come-back" on the fairways.

Bit by bit, I am reassembling the former self- my bag of shots is returning and my former golfing buddies are beginning to include me in weekend foursomes. After

teeing it up for thirty years, it is hard to describe the thrill of accepting invitations now.

Tournaments were especially rough near the end of my drinking. I rationalized that setting up drinks did no harm; I was just setting up the right frame of mind for competition. It became evident that I lacked the confidence to play sharp. That hungry winning edge was submerged beneath the booze. My former attitude fo "bring on the challengers" was depressed into one of "if I'm down at the 9th hole, I'll get a couple of quickies to enable me to rally to rule."

There was the time in the club championship I was a "shoo-in" against the kid who never before had reached the finals due to nervousness under pressure. As we teed off, I could hear his rooters whispering, "I hope he doesn't get too nervous" . . . . .

Get nervous! That was a joke. Despite all the competition I had under my belt, that poor tenderfoot did not know anything about the degree of shakiness I was inwardly experiencing as a result

of the previous night of hard training. While trying to play that final match, I was losing both ends of what seemed like the international finals of a handball game that was using my stomach for its court.

Sad is the tragedy of alcohol over many promising golf champions. Great players have failed to reach national, state, collegiate and local heights because unfortunately they became slaves to a cup--that was not the cup planted in the rich bent grass on the putting greens. The biographies of all the great golfers at some time find print. I have read most of them. Invariably a chapter is devoted to the psychological side of golf, that winning pitch which carried the contender to his heights as a champion. The great golfers advance a uniform conviction about wimpering and it is this: they played their best not when they were concerned about the whole round or the seventy-two required holes to victory, or when they worried about a competitor's progress. The great scores were recorded only when they concentrated upon JUST ONE STROKE AT A TIME and dismissed every wandering thought about any other aspect of the tournament.

Isn't this a wonderful parallel to the saying embraced in our Fellowship: a day at a time? If golfdom's great emperor, Bobby Jones, the aggressive little squire, Gene Sarazen, and the

master shotmaker, Byron Nelson, of yesteryear, all concur with the modern golfing giants like Palmer, Player, Lima, and the perhaps destined Jack Nicklaus, the the only approach to a demanding and precise game is a stroke-at-a-time, then aren't we fools to feel that we cant approach life's problems one day at a time?

Aren't failures much like golf? If we concentrate only on past blunders, we will never be in the frame of mind to win in the future. Putting it another way, maybe life is like a 72-hole tourney played for 72 years. So we blundered 18 or so--concentrat entirely on the bad years and we'll bobble the remaining. But by meeting the future with honest zest a day at a time we can become the real winner when the final scores are tallied and the champions acclaimed.

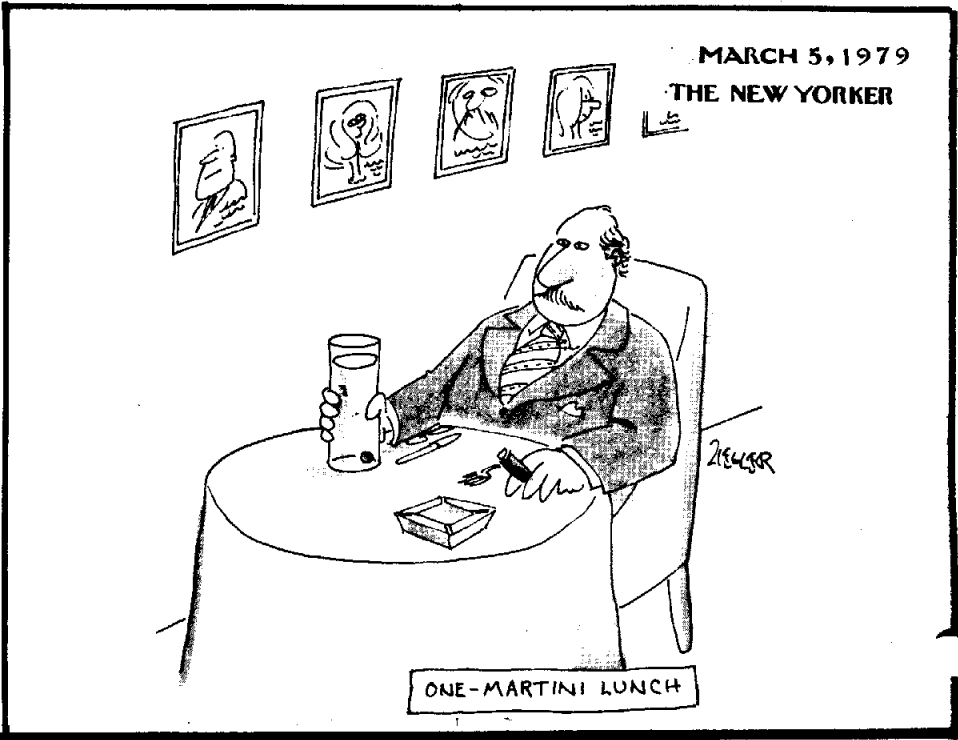
