## AA Roulette



Have you been dry for quite a long time? Is AA becoming a little boresome, something that is certainly needed by most of the group, but in your case has probably served its purpose? Do you secretly believe that, with all the knowledge you now have of alcoholics and alcoholism, you could probably handle the stuff; are you perhaps toying with the idea that some day, when time and place and all other factors are just right, you may TRY IT AGAIN?

If those are your conscious or subconscious thoughts, if you feel that another try at the bottle might be a pleasant thrill, why don't you try, instead the thrill of Russian Roulette? You know... that game where you put only one bullet in a revolver, spin the cylinder, point the thing at your temple and pull the trigger? The odds in Russian Roulette are very much in favor of the player: four chances out of five no harm whatever would be done (not even a hangover). Of course, there IS that fifth chance... that ONE\* chance that would mean disaster... curtains... the end... but the chances are, four out of five, that wouldn't happen to you on the first try.

Now, you think that's silly? You think only a moron would do such a thing; and what does that have to do with your taking a drink, anyway? Here's what it has to do with it, my fellow alky: you're

planning a much more foolish and dangerous game- you'r going to play AA Roulette.

In AA Roulette, you must (mentally) select four other players who are "good AAs" with long periods of sobriety behind them. You would bet your last dollar that not one of them would take a drink--ever. But, for the sake of this game, we'll presume they have the same idea in mind that you have, that they could take a drink or two without doing any particular harm. Although you think YOU could do it, you don't believe THEY could; you've learned too much about alcoholics to believe that. Well, if you've forgotten to look at yourself honestly, let's look at you through their eyes: THEY don't believe YOU could do it, either. So, the consensus indicates that each of the five will get drunk and not one of them will emerge from the spree a controlled drinker, after pulling the trigger and taking that first drink.

So what? Five good AAs, who have grown to appreciate their sobriety, each have a slip. What harm has been done, that is, to the individuals themselves? the chances are that one or two of them will come

back into AA with no apparent harm having been done at all, perhaps even stronger for having learned a lesson the hard way. We'll stretch a point, for the purpose of this game, and say that such happens to four out of five. But according to the law of averages as we have witnessed it over the years, it just doesn't stand to reason that five out of five will make the grade. At least one of the five will never come back and his slip will eventually end in disaster or death. At least one of the five is now having his last chance at sobriety. You probably agree with that premise, but "It would not happen to me," you say... and "would not happen to me" echoes in four other minds. The grim consensus again indicates that not one of the five has a better chance than any one of the other four. Of course, the odds are it wouldn't be you; four chances out of five, perhaps, this isn't your absolutely final opportunity for sobriety; four chances out of five a slip for you wouldn't mean death or disaster.

Do you want to pull the trigger and find out? I don't.

# Rand Corp. Restudies Alcoholism, Drink Remains a Villain

A new study by the Rand Corporation for the federal government concludes that alcoholics run a greater risk of relapse if they attempt to drink in moderation.

A few years ago, Rand issued a controversial study which indicated that some alcoholics could return to moderate drinking. This was based on following the lives of one thousand people who had undergone treatment for alcoholism. The first study followed them for 18 months, but the second study reported on the same group after four years.

Rand researchers found after four years, a large number of those one thousand patients had gone back to drinking. Furthermore, they discovered that the relapse rate was greatest among those who attempted to drink in moderation! Those who tried to abstain had a far lower rate of relapse.

Armed with this new evidence, the Dept. of Health, Education and Welfare has issued an official statement, concluding that the Rand data "reveals that long term abstinence is the most appropriate treatment goal for persons highly dependent on alcohol."

One tragic note in the Rand study. An estimated 14.5% of those in treatment DIED by the time of this followup: a death rate 2 1/2 times the expected for the general population.

Rand has confirmed what many in AA have known for a long time.

This is a killer disease.

This article has been printed because of the importance of the Rand studies and their possible effect on all of us. Some in AA have wondered why we have not spoken up against this and promote our program. The reasons can be found in our 10th Tradition and the 11th- we attract, rather than promote.

Are on the other side-----Anon.

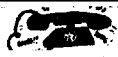

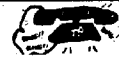

**ROSA BURWELL**  
 Rosa Burwell, who had been active in  
 the San Diego County Fellowship of  
 Alcoholics Anonymous for 34 years died  
 May 24th .

Rosa would have celebrated her 35th  
 anniversary of her continuous member-  
 ship in AA on June 13th.

A native of Mathews, Va., she came  
 to San Diego from Philadelphia in 1946  
 with her husband, the late James M.  
 Burwell, who was one of the founding  
 members of AA and a contributor to the  
 book, "Alcoholics Anonymous".

A member of the coordinating coun-  
 cil that opened the first AA central off-  
 ice in San Diego in 1947, Rosa served as  
 a volunteer in the office for the next 25  
 years. She was active in the San Diego  
 Women's Group, and was a founder of the  
 Mission Hills and Sunday Mid-Day groups.

In 1966 she became the first woman  
 delegate from San Diego to the General  
 Service Conference of AA in New York.  
 She and her husband also were among the  
 first members of the San Diego Alano  
 Club which was organized in 1948.

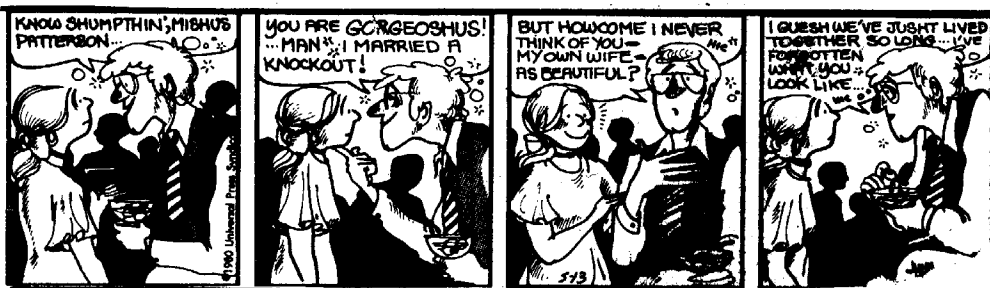

### WE'RE NOT SAINTS BUT WE'RE BETTER. . . . .

For those interested in statistics, the yearly financial report for 1979 from G. S.O. shows some interesting figures in group contributions. The Mid-So-Calif. Area ranks 5th largest among the 91 delegate areas both in total amount of group contributions and group members. Here is how we compare to 1978:

Year	Total Group Contributions	Contrib. Per Capita
1978	595	1.85
1979	623	2.10

Overall contributions from groups and members in 1979 were \$158,200 over 1978, a 14.6% gain. Even the percentage of groups contributing showed a gain.

This allowed the 6% discount on literature orders over \$25 during the year 1979. Inflation and growth of the Fellowship, however, caused the expense of group services to increase by \$219,200 (8.5%). If more groups will join in the effort to broaden the base of group support, there could be further reduction in the price of Literature.

DELEGATE'S MESSAGE.....

At the recent Conference in New York I had the pleasure of meeting nearly all the Panel 29 and Panel 30 delegates, many of whom I had known previously through the Pacific Regional Assemblies. One of these was Gary U., of San Diego. He presented me with a very interesting booklet called "The Story of Alcoholics Anonymous in San Diego County" which is very well written with a wealth of AA history which began in 1940 in that area, and which shows a lot of real hard work by some AA members dedicated to archives as they pertain to our fellowship.

I have for quite a time endeavored to interest AA members in the Mid-Southern California Assembly Area in the importance of archives--the history on tape, or film or by the written word of the whole story of Alcoholics Anonymous in Orange, Riverside and San Bernardino counties and that part of Los Angeles County which is in our Area. It would be wonderful if some person or persons would undertake such a project. It is so easy to lose all the written things and those who began AA here are rapidly leaving us. Once they are gone it is practically impossible to get the information.

A few of the older groups have some form of history of their meetings, notably Los Altos in Long Beach. I shall stick out my neck and ask anyone who has archive material to please get it to me or Goldene personally, or leave at any of the six central offices in the area. Also I welcome any assistance in getting this material in presentable shape. 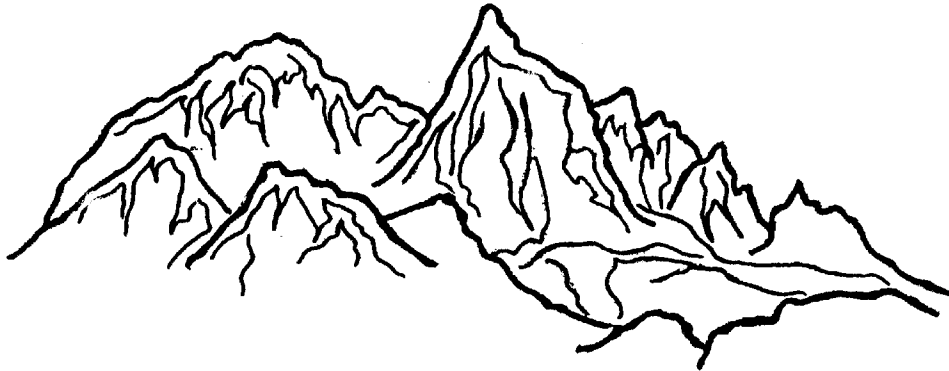
