The A. A. Group - Who Needs One?

Friday 9:15 p.m.: A young lady is sharing the room is very still as she describes her alcoholism and the stroke she had at age 22.

He goes on to describe the physical handicap she suffers now, due to the stroke. She expresses her gratitude to A.A. and to the baseball team and the painful humiliation of trying to throw with a not so good left hand. The room is filled with people deeply moved by the young lady's story. It wasn't always like that at our GROUP

Not so long ago most of the stories were negative. attendance was way down and members spoke of their dislike for the meeting. Getting people to serve was more difficult. One young lady raised her hand to share, she said she really resented the negative talk and that she loved this meeting and suggested they help make it a better GROUP or move on.

A group inventory was held by a steering committee and changes were made. The meeting slowly changed back to a GROUP again. We found the answer on page 35 of the "A.A. Group Pamphlet". It describes the difference between

a group and a meeting. It says, "meetings are now the primary activity of each group, and the most common way of "carrying the message" to both new-comers and other members who want to maintain recovery". The pamphlet goes on to say "groups", on the other hand continue to exist even when the meeting is not taking place. They are the people who come pretty regularly to the meetings and act loyally and accept responsibility toward the group. Some attend simply as listeners; others participate and help with the chores. Sometimes A.A. members gather regularly just for lunch, or picnics, or meet in each others homes to get the kind of sharing they like most.

Some members want more than just being "dry". Often if a group's member seems to be having an unusual amount of trouble, participation in more of A.A. has been the answer.

A A. history shows that "meetings" which "grow up" usually develop enough mature strength of their own to become independent of their first founding "parent" members. And, like growing children, as they mature they take notice of and participate in activities outside their own interests in themselves. They begin to perform their share of service in the local

intergroup and in General Service activities. By accepting new responsibilities and challenges in the world outside themselves, meetings seem to grow into GROUPS.

The GROUP that I attend is an open participation, with a speaker once a month. The average attendance is from 80 to 110 people. We've had 8 steering committee meetings in the last eight years. All of the reports from Intergroup,

General Service, and Hospital and Institutions are given directly to the entire GROUP once a month. The GROUP contributes to our local central office, the Mid-Southern Calif. Area, (MSCA) and G.S.O in New York, using the 60-30-10 break down after expenses.

Our GROUP expenses include literature, refreshments, rent donation travel reimbursement for our speaker, telephone books with members names included for our new friends sobriety chips, and birthday cards.

Elections are held every six months. Job descriptions are listed in a notebook. No nomination, members simply sign up that are willing to greet, clean-up, set-up, etc. After a month of sign ups, unsigned ballots are distributed and voted on

In addition to the regular 8:30pm meeting we have a "beginners meeting" from 7 to 8.

Our GROUP speaks as a GROUP when invited. Some of our other activities for the individual include volleyball, baseball, (men and women) retreats, coffee after meetings, birthday celebrations in homes after meeting, camp outs, fishing, golf, couples meetings, putting together weddings, going away parties, moving people, and we even have a family financial planner available in our GROUP. Of course not everyone participates in these activities, but they are available.

The GROUP members attend a number of other GROUP meetings...Book Study, Step Study, and Men and Woman stag meetings.

We have our ups and downs, two or three cliques, but the bottom line is stay sober, carry the message and an overpowering love for each other.

Without you I would be better off dead, my life would be empty and useless. But you lift me from my waiting grave and once again you show me what my life should be.

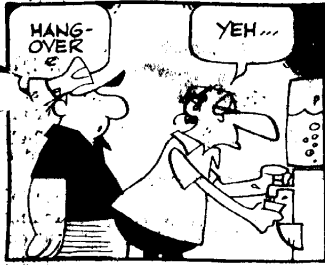
Loneliness may still torture my soul and worthlessness may still fill my mind at times, but each time they strike, you are there to help me through and show me a friend.

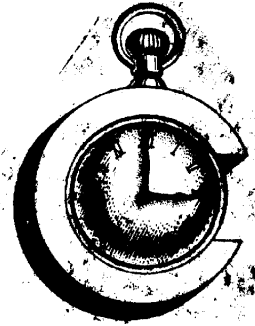

A NEW MONTHLY FEATURE

For The NEWCOMER

This column is for the new-comer. It is written by a newcomer who has had some experience referred to (sometimes respectfully) as the "oldtimer". The purpose of this column is to help my fellow newcomers deal with this strange, sometimes unpredictable and always inconsistent example of sobriety; that proverbial walking Big Book--the Oldtimer.

The oldtimer is kindly, cruel, generous to a fault, and mean as hell. He is a contradiction. He is a disruption to the rational thinking processes of the new man in the fellowship. He professes deep understanding of the newcomer in search of sobriety and in the same instant, he refuses to see the unique circumstances which brought the two of them together in

the first place. The old-timer makes this program sound as if any moron could learn to live sober; at the same time, he fails to recognize that the moron he is talking to has a very different personality from the other morons in this program. The simple fact is: Oldtimers refuse to recognize individuality.

I know how you feel, fellow newcomers. I too have suffered the frustration of working with oldtimers. And I want you to realize that we must continue to try. What's more, there is a solution. I discovered this through trial and error; and I am quite willing to share it with you-- for such is the fellowship of AA.

It's quite simple actually. All we have to do is humor them. I know it doesn't sound easy, but it is simple. Just do what they tell you to do. It makes them happy and keeps them off your back. Get a sponsor like they tell you. Go to meetings, don't drink, take the twelve steps. Do what the old folks tell you. Like I said, it ain't easy, but it sure helps to keep those old fellas sober.

A GREAT DEAL OF ATTENTION in Alcoholics Anonymous today focusses on a wide variety of outside interests which operate in the field of alcoholic recovery and to the policy we maintain of cooperation but not affiliation. In many instances there seems to be a fine line between these two endeavors.

Tradition Six says: "An AA group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the A.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose."

There is much to be said of the clubs which since the very early days of our existence have done so much to help us in our primary purpose. The AA Guidelines on Clubs (which incidentally, is not AA approved literature) is a distillation of the AA policy on our relationship and cooperation with them and has grown tremendously since their inception over forty years ago. All of the experience gained through the years is explained in the Club Guideline; most of the suggestions in regard to Club operation is well covered.

It seems to be best for the management of clubs, as well as the operation in fact, to adhere to the Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous as closely as possible. Most of the clubs in our particular area here do not interfere in any basic way with the meetings which they rent to. In reality a club is but a landlord in the strictest sense of the word. Therefore when a group decides to locate in a club it follows that they must adhere to the rules governing such a location. When those rules infringe on the operation of the meeting under our regular format (or agenda) then the group conscience must decide how it can best be handled. Unruly or other unseemingly conduct by any AA members or guests, especially newcomers, must be handled by the group members themselves when the occasion arises in AA meetings. In the club itself, when a meeting is not involved, it is the responsibility of those in charge of the club itself.

Barring of alcoholics to the clubs usually carries with it that persons cannot be barred from AA meetings for any reason if they are seeking help for their drinking problem. We, as recovering alcoholics and most of those who are managing or operating clubs are members of our fellowship, should be able to handle situations involving bad conduct without the necessity of publishing names of banned persons on the doorways or bulletin boards of these locations. But if the club does this, and feels justified in so doing, there is not a great deal we can do. A meeting can always relocate if the membership so desires. No group should ever be in a position of debt or obligation to a club or any other facility. We are self-supporting and must remain so if we are to carry the message in a group effort.

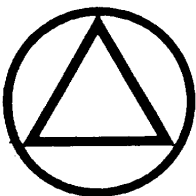
If what I am writing is read in the spirit in which it is written, that of whole hearted cooperation, then no one should be offended. The traditions are all written simply and I do not find many of them possible of much analyzation which will justify ignoring them. Nor of "bending" them.

Most of the many clubs in our area in Southern California are a very valuable means of assistance in bringing the message of recovery to the hosts who come to us. Many of our members first found AA in a club and it is good we have them. Our main theme is that the newcomer be informed about what Alcoholics Anonymous IS and what it IS NOT.
