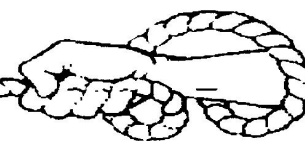

It's not too late to attend an A.A. International Convention!

Well, actually it is too late to attend the one that just ended in San Antonio, Texas. You missed that one! But it is not too late, and not too early either, to start planning to go to the next one in July 2015 in Atlanta, Georgia.

Several members of my favorite meeting in Tustin attended the 3-day convention in San Antonio and were eager to share their experiences and observations. My sources revealed that attending the San Antonio Convention this year was well worth the effort and cost of travel and hotels. After all this was the 75th anniversary of A.A. and the 13th International Convention. The theme was “a vision for us” and it was quite an impressive sight to see 50,000 sober A.A.s from over 75 countries at the meetings and on the crowded Riverwalk of San Antonio. The green colored entry badges were seen everywhere and were an immediate conversation starter. My sources said everyone was very friendly and polite and that was confirmed by the local news coverage as well.

The local news reported that the local economy did well too, \$16 million from the conventioners but bar tenders reported business was slow, very slow! They should have expected that! Many restaurants had a 20% discount for conventioners showing their green badges. Locals and attendees were all satisfied. One of my sources reported that the local police focused on trying to prevent jay walking and that seemed to be their biggest problem. But even that was overlooked at the very end of the closing meeting. There is some irony there considering the story of the jaywalker in our Big Book.

From my inside sources I learned that the speakers were top notch at the Alamodome and that the count down at the Saturday Night Oldtimers meeting featured members with over 40 years of sobriety and one with 63 years! Hospitality suites were hosted by a variety of groups and commemorative pins and buttons were distributed, and probably swapped and traded too. The closing meeting was very powerful.

My sources revealed that they planned months in advance to attend and they gave me some dollar figures too. One said his flight to and from San Antonio cost \$450, but it could have been lower with better advance notice. The other drove, but that won't be reasonable for Atlanta. Hotel rooms were \$139 per night double-occupancy, and a suite was \$209. Those figures may or may not be just rough guidelines for the next convention five years from now.

They also gave me some tips that could apply to Atlanta in 2015. Plan now and sign up for the convention and for hotel rooms as soon as they are available! Get your rooms at a hotel close to the action. You don't want to spend a lot of time commuting during the 3 days of sobriety events. Watch the airfares and get plane tickets in advance on one of the discount sites on the Internet. So start planning, budgeting and saving now for the 14th International A.A. Convention in Atlanta in July 2015! Don't miss this next one!

The 12 Concepts For World Service

Concept 9 (short form)

Good service leadership at all levels is indispensable for our future functioning and safety. Primary world service leadership, once exercised by the founders, must necessarily be assumed by the trustees, Page 575, Alcoholics Anonymous, (fourth edition).

This is the concept that sets the stage for what would become the Alcoholics Anonymous method of selecting our leadership. We call it our Third Legacy. From the approximately 60 thousand groups registered in the U.S. and Canada, each supposedly has a General Service Representative (GSR). The GSRs then elect District Committee Members (DCMs) and from this rather large assemblage Conference delegates are elected.

But this is not your run-of-the-polls election. This is Alcoholics Anonymous. If even a hint of a popularity contest surfaces, attendees will see the Third Legacy in action. All of the nominees are on the ballot. If any delegate can acquire a 67% majority he is elected on the spot. And the election continues.

After the third ballot, the candidates are reduced to the two with the most votes and the balloting continues. If, after a fourth or fifth ballot and no candidate has the required 67 percent, those names are placed in a hat and the winner's name is drawn.

For the General Service Board, the process is somewhat less time consuming. Ten of the 21 Board members are elected by Conference vote. Again using the Third Legacy, the body can select a candidate for the eight regional and two Trustees at large.

The remaining trustees include the seven Class A (non-alcoholic) members who are chosen because of their expertise in the field of alcoholism. And the last four trustees are representatives of Alcoholics Anonymous World Services and The Grapevine (2 each).

If you're one of those unfortunates who can't find your copy of the Service Manual, please let me loan you my copy. Bill W. has plenty to say about service in Alcoholics Anonymous.

WEB STATS

On July 9, 2010, our Web site redesign went live. Thus, our statistics start from a new base. From July 9th through July 31st, there were 9,678 "visits" to www.oc-aa.org.

The first on-line issue of the *Lifeline* was posted to our Web site in July of 2006. However, when our site hosting company changed servers in June of 2007, some usage statistics were lost. Since July, 2007, the *Lifeline* home page has been viewed 16,018 times. Individual issue files have been viewed 29,967 times. During July, 382 visitors viewed the July issue, while past issues were viewed 420 times

Profiles in Sobriety



Mary P., Huntington Beach; 19 years
(sober since 8/7/1991)

What was your first impression of A.A.?
Laughter. My first meeting was at 6 p.m. at an Alano club in a Dallas, Texas, business park. Almost everyone was dressed in business attire having just come from work. I'll never forget they were laughing, happy, joyous and free, and I was not.

What made you realize A.A. would work for you?

It worked. I was just showing up to prove A.A. wouldn't work for me because I thought my "problems" were unique and much worse than theirs. Willingness is the key, and I had the willingness to prove A.A. wouldn't work for me. One day I showed up for the morning meeting at the Alano club and my name was on the white board because I had 30 days of sobriety (they don't do chips). Wow was I surprised!!!

In your opinion, what is the most important thing a newcomer should know about A.A.?

Keep coming back. There is a miracle for them in A.A.—don't leave before the miracle happens.

Take a wild guess - how many A.A. meetings have you been to?
5,500

What's your current weekly meeting routine?

I prefer morning meetings—three per week is normal. When I am struggling with an issue, I attend A.A. every day.

Why do you continue to go to meetings?

I want to continue to grow. Most of my adult life was spent in a blackout, which was my drinking goal each day. Through working the A.A. steps, I discovered that I want to have relationships with others, but don't know how. My A.A. home group was my first attempt to have a relationship where I gave back. Being a regular member of a group that knows me has given me the family that alcoholism took away.

What do you remember the most about your first few months of sobriety?

Almost nothing. I was a walking zombie. I attended morning, noon and evening A.A. meetings and worked in between.

Do you remember the first time you asked for help – what was that like?

I don't recall the first time, but I do recall the last time. Asking for help is getting easier, but it's still not my first move.

What has been your biggest challenge in sustained sobriety?

At first, not drinking was challenging, one day at a time. Today sobriety is easier, but still one day at a time. One of my challenges is not letting the gifts of the program take me away from the program. Comfortable sobriety comes from staying in sobriety, not just being sober.

Do you ever think you might be cured for good?

No. I have a thinking disease, my head is working on new ideas and angles everyday.

Besides yourself, who benefits the most from your sobriety?

Everyone I come in contact with. Starting the day with A.A. gives me the tools to deal with the people, places, and things that come up everyday.

What's the best thing about being sober?

Besides not dying of alcoholism and being a part of life, having true meaningful friendships built on truth and reality, not a 12-pack.

Step 9

Made Direct Amends To Such People Wherever Possible, Except When To Do So Would Injure Them Or Others.

Number 9 of 12 articles on the 12 Steps

So, here I was, a newcomer - 5 days sober and absolutely desperate to stay that way. I looked around the meeting room and everyone seemed a lot happier than me, and I wanted what they had. And I was ready to go to any lengths to get it. They read the 12 steps as part of Chapter 5, and I was finally listening after several months of coming to A.A. meetings drunk and really not hearing much of the readings. But now I was serious, (and did I mention desperate?). Well, everything was okay, and I remained willing. Step 4 and 5 might be slight problems, but I could struggle through them, after all, did I mention, I was desperate? And then, the hammer dropped – step 9. I remember clear as a bell thinking, “Are you kidding me – making amends to all those people who harmed ME?” And so the decision was made to not even start the steps, because I wasn’t that desperate! So, I suffered for another nine months before I reached the level of desperation in sobriety I needed to reach in order to become truly willing to go to any lengths for sobriety.



I got a sponsor, and he took me through the steps out of the Big Book over 5 months, and, sure enough, we reached the 9th Step. The dreaded 9th Step! But, miracle of miracles - I had remained willing to take my sponsor’s direction and as we progressed through the work, the 9th Step hadn’t been a really big deal. But, now I was facing the fact that I actually had to do it. And you know something – it wasn’t really a big deal! Remembering the wording in the 8th Step, “Remember it was agreed in the beginning we would go to any lengths for victory of alcohol.” And I was still willing.

The scariest thing I had done in my life, to that point, was going to my wife and amending that relationship. Merriam-Webster defines amend thusly - **1** to put right; **2** to change or modify for the better. I had to have faith that this is what I was attempting to do. And then, I had to take the action. It is no accident that the 9th Step, (and 6 others) are described in a chapter called “Into Action.” A price was finally paid in the 9th step – the further confession of my shortcomings and the leveling of my pride. In the process, everything that had come before this was preparation, necessary preparation, but simply preparation. There were many more amends to be made, but that action set the tone. I was finally living a free man. I have not lived the same since. Oh, and did I mention that I had been desperate.

Dear Lance,

Consider this passage from Page 163 of the Big Book: “You are saying to your self: ‘I’m jittery and alone. I couldn’t do that.’ But you can. You forget that you have just now tapped a source of power much greater than yourself. To duplicate, with such backing, what we have accomplished is only a matter of willingness, patience and labor.” Start by getting a sponsor who has worked the steps. On page 164: “Still you may say: ‘But I will not have the benefit of contact with you write this book.’ We cannot be sure. God will determine that, so you who must remember that your real reliance is always upon Him...”

Correction: A reader, Bob C. of Sun Valley, ID, writes to tell us that we got our dates wrong in the July issue column. He correctly reminds us that Bill W. and Dr. Bob first met Mother’s Day weekend in 1935. Dr. Bob had his last drink on June 10, 1935, the day that marks A.A.’s founding.

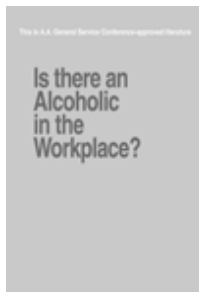

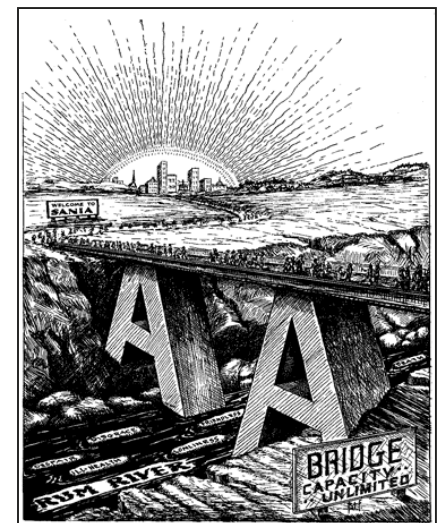

CALL FORWARDING

**“Alcoholics Anonymous,
how may we help you?”**



CALL FORWARDING:

The call forwarding program instituted by Orange County Central Office insures that our help line phones are answered by volunteers 24/7. During hours when the Central Office is closed, calls to the Central Office are forwarded to a call forwarding volunteer's home or cell phone, where the volunteer answers the calls just as if he or she were sitting in the Central Office. This service allows the Central Office to realize a significant cost saving because we do not need to contract with a phone answering service. Even more vital, when a call is placed to Alcoholics Anonymous in Orange County, the caller will be talking to an Alcoholics Anonymous member not a phone service! This truly is “front-line” 12th Step work and we would appreciate any time you can give.

SHIFTS:

Monday thru Friday shifts are 6am to 9am, 6pm to 9pm and 9pm to 6am. Saturday shifts start with the 6am to 9am. The Central Office opens and covers from 9am to 1pm on Saturdays. The phones are than forwarded to volunteers to cover the phones from 1pm to 4pm, 4pm to 7pm, 7pm to 10pm and 10pm to 6am. On Sundays and Holidays shifts begin at 6am with the 6am to 10am, and continue with 10am to 2pm, 2pm to 6pm, 6pm to 10pm and 10pm to 6am.

VOLUNTEERING:

In order to volunteer for this service it is suggested that you have two years of sobriety. You must than arrange with the Central Office Manager in Santa Ana or the Satellite Office Manager in Mission Viejo for a brief orientation session which will be held at one of the offices. Shifts are available please call the Central Office at (714) 556-4555 or the Satellite Office at (949) 582-2697.

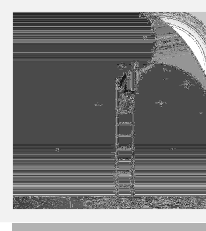

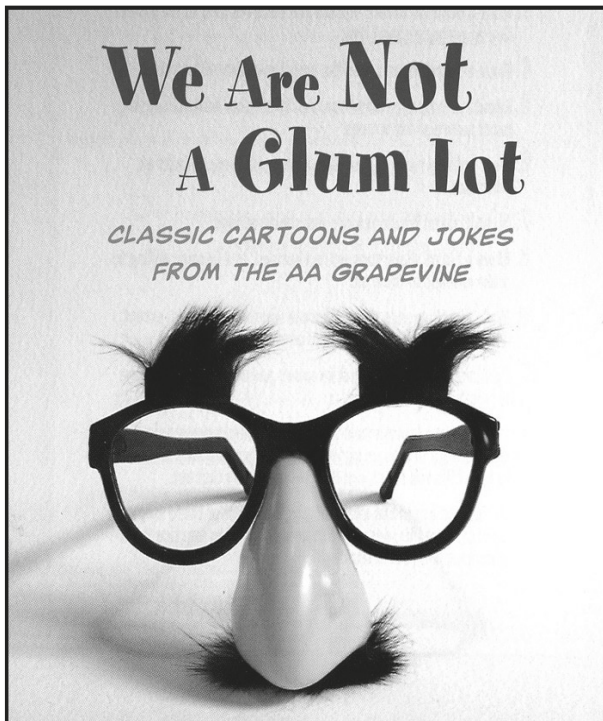
