## Step One is No Cakewalk

Step One: *"We admitted we were powerless over alcohol, that our lives were unmanageable."*

"I spent the last seven years of my drinking pretending that I wasn't an alcoholic. And I was willing to fight with you if you intimated that you thought I behaved like one.

But, several trips to jail, a few drunk driving arrests, the loss of my family and the threat of losing my job finally made me willing to accept some of the suggestions of members of Alcoholics Anonymous. Grudgingly.

For most of that seven year period, well-meaning judges assumed that my troubles would be eliminated if I could just find an A.A. meeting and follow the simple instructions. Their orders infuriated me. "Ten meetings in 30 days," ordered one jurist. "Fifteen meetings in 60 days," commanded another.

So I got the card signed and returned it to the court. And continued to drink through it all.

My last drunk driving arrest and the prosecutor's suggestion that a visit to state prison might prove useful did get my attention.

"Do you think you are likely to become capable of controlling your drinking?" asked the man who would become my sponsor. "Probably not," I acknowledged. "Is your life suddenly going to become manageable?" Bob asked. "It doesn't look like it," I responded. And that's how I took Step One the first time.

I have taken the step many times since then, sometimes daily to prevent my notably faulty memory from betraying me. And since we all know that alcohol is cunning, baffling and powerful, I need additional insurance to make sure I don't forget who I am, what I am or where I need to be.

So I go to at least one meeting every day, stay active in the Hospitals and Institutions committee, work with as many alcoholics as I can fit into my schedule, say "yes" when asked to help my home group or any other and volunteer for phone duty and other chores at the Central Office and the Service Committee and just generally act as if I'm really a responsible member of this Fellowship.

My sponsor knows I'm not as responsible as I could be, but I do know I'm powerless over alcohol and that my life is unmanageable. Those two truths are immutable and constant and I know I can't ever forget them.

And that's part of my daily prayer — that God will keep me pointed in the way He wants me to go and I will follow His direction.

## How We Stay United

**Tradition One** - Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends on A.A. unity.

I was sober about three years when Margaret A., who worked in the ad department at the newspaper, came to me and said that it was a shame that there was nothing that even looked like a daytime A.A. meeting in downtown Long Beach. I agreed with her.

“Why doesn’t someone start one?” I remember asking her. “Why don’t you and me start one?” she shot back.

After a lot of anguish and self-doubt and many recriminations, we opened at the Long Beach Mall in a conference room. We couldn’t pay the rent so we landed in a conference room at the newspaper. But the newspaper needed the room for conferences of their own so we went back to looking again. The Los Angeles Newspaper Guild said yes to our inquiry and for the next eight years we held A.A. meetings in that dinky union hall. And that’s a roundabout way of getting at what this Tradition One piece is supposed to be saying.

A meeting at noon at 6th and Pine in Long Beach is not exactly going to attract the cream of the A.A. crop. We had a lot of alcoholics but we also had heroin addicts, coke users, an occasional Alanon and a cross-section of other afflictions. No problem. Our opening used the “Open Meeting” intro provided by General Service and we rarely had to caution people to talk only of our difficulties with alcohol.

There was another problem, however. We did Chapter 3 and Chapter 5 at the start of the meeting but waited until 12:30 to read the Traditions and pass the hat. When 12:29 rolled around, the leader was confronted with an exodus of about half of the room, headed for the sidewalk to smoke. A smoker myself, I understood the need but found myself wondering why these alkie couldn’t at least wait until the Traditions had been read. Finally, we inserted a paragraph for the leader to read that said we would take a break immediately after the Traditions were read. They still left early.

Finally, I asked the secretary if I could lead the meeting the next Monday. She said yes and I did so. The Traditions were read to a half-empty hall. When the smokers returned the meeting resumed.

“Welcome back everyone,” I remember saying. “For all of you who missed them, we’ll read the Traditions again.” I handed the page to a member who read the Traditions a second time.

“What was that all about?” a member we called Bicycle Bob asked.

“They need to hear the Traditions,” I answered.

“They’re the reason there is an Alcoholics Anonymous today.”

“They don’t come for the Traditions,” Bob said. “They come for the fellowship. That’s their common welfare.” Strangest of all, many got sober and stayed sober.

### Check Your Gear, Tiger

I came to my first meeting in 1974 but still had some research to do and so thoroughly followed your path down for four more years visiting various institutions while still attending a few meetings. During this period I had had several “alleged” sponsors who all gave up on me after a while usually reminding me that “they carried the message, not the alcoholic”. I was more interested in being carried than listening to any message.

The miracle happened in 1978 when I returned to California bankrupt in all departments, attended the meeting where I had started four years earlier, and received the gift of surrender. My surrender was marked by two events. I got a real sponsor named Red, and I took a subscription to the Lifeline. These were to be the evidence of my commitment. In my mindset of the time, the subscription was akin to applying for membership, as it were.

My new “real sponsor, Red, was a very kind man who was married to another recovering alcoholic named Ellen. They were to be my parents for a while, even though I was forty-eight years old. They had the God given ability to mix kindness with truth and had the patience to wait for me to get well even though, at times, it seemed that I would never get the program. You see, I was very smart at that time!

## Concept 1

Hi, my name is Jim and I am an alcoholic and this year I have the privilege of sharing some of my experience and/or understanding of the 12 Concepts.

Starting with the 2001 publishing of the Fourth Edition of the Book Alcoholics Anonymous, the 12 Concepts (Short Form) have been included on pages 574 and 575, and are therefore readily available to all.

Before getting into the First Concept I'd like to start with a little background on the 12 Concepts, which represent the Third Legacy of Service. Bill W. first introduced some of the ideas contained in the Concepts in his closing remarks at the 1956 (6<sup>th</sup>) General Service Conference. 1956 was just one year after the full acceptance of the General Service Conference after its five year trial period, and only 6 years after the official acceptance of the 12 Traditions.

In his 1960 talk at the opening conference dinner, Bill W. suggested that it might be necessary to codify the principles and relationships upon which our world service function rests, from the group right through to the trustees, and said he had been trying to prepare a set of interpretive articles called "Twelve Concepts for World Service," which he said represented an attempt to put on paper the why of our service structure, and in such a fashion that the highly valuable experience of the past, and the conclusions we have drawn from it cannot be lost.

At the 1962 General Service Conference, after some more work and much discussion the Concepts came up for a vote, and were approved unanimously.

Except for the 12<sup>th</sup> Concept, which is also known as the 12<sup>th</sup> article of the Conference Charter (more commonly known as the Warranties) Bill never intended the Concepts to be written in stone. In his introduction to the Concepts he states that each new generation of AA world servants will be eager to make operational improvements, however he also points out that change does not always spell out progress.

Concept 1: "Final responsibility and ultimate authority for A.A. world services should always reside in the collective conscience of our whole Fellowship." In his essay on Concept 1, Bill W. writes about the pre-1950 days when responsibility for A.A. resided in a group of trustees, then known as the Alcoholic Foundation. This board was organized in 1938 and was made up of a majority of non-alcoholic members. These members were wonderful friends of A.A., but many of them were not in touch with the groups, or even known by the

general membership. Bill W., and Dr. Bob, as advisors to this board were the link between the board and the groups. Prompted in 1948 by the discovery that Dr. Bob was suffering from a fatal illness, it became clear that the final responsibility and ultimate authority for A.A. should rightly be transferred to the whole fellowship.

This was accomplished through the creation of a representative conference. Delegates were elected and convened in 1951 on an 5 year experimental basis. The experiment was rooted in Tradition 2 which states "For our group purpose, there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as he may express Himself in our Group Conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern." The experiment worked so well that at the St. Louis International Convention in 1955, Bill W. on behalf of Dr. Bob, the Trustees and A.A.s old-timers, transferred the responsibility for world service to the entire Fellowship. The General Service Conference then became the advisor to the Trustees.

So much for the brief history. How is it working today? I have been involved in the conference process and from my experience it works very well at the conference level. The biggest problem we have is obtaining an informed group conscience. This is where the General Service Representative (G.S.R.) comes in. Does your group have one? If you do have one does he regularly attend District and Area meetings? Does she report on a regular basis and obtain the group's conscience on matters affecting A.A. as a whole? Or would your group rather just let them make up their own mind?

Red called me "Tiger" though I felt more like a mouse. He would start his "lessons" with "Well, you see Tiger, this is how it works..." He had been an Air Force officer and a test pilot in his day and so, much of his vocabulary included many aeronautical terms which I decided I'd better try to understand.

I would call to tell him I was very confused about something or other, which was not surprising, and he would respond with "Well, Tiger, I'll tell you. When you're in a cloud with no instruments and can't see a "doggone" thing, the rule is that you keep going straight. Don't make any turns at this time or you could end up going in circles in the cloud till you run out of fuel. Not a good idea.

So just keep on flying the course till the cloud clears. Then, later, I would call all excited about something or other and hear the words: "Tiger, sounds to me like you're flying kind of high there, which, of course, is fine for experienced flyers, but, in your case, it might be a good idea to level off a bit and begin a gradual descent while you still have some fuel left. And, by the way, check your gear. Make sure you can land this thing. Did you do your 12 -Step checklist before you took off? Call me when you're on the ground."

Red is gone now but, obviously, his words are still with me and not a few newcomers have had to hear me remind them to "Check your gear".

## Our Principles: Acceptance Comes First

A new feature appears in this issue of the Lifeline. Each month, *The Lifeline* will take a look at the Principles of Alcoholics Anonymous. Our first Principle is Acceptance. In the February issue we will look at Faith.

"And acceptance is the answer to all my problems today. When I am disturbed, it is because I find some person, place, thing, or situation, some fact of my life, unacceptable to me, and I can find no serenity until I accept that person, place, thing, or situation as being exactly as it is supposed to be at this moment. Nothing, absolutely nothing, happens in God's world by mistake. Until I could accept my alcoholism, I could not stay sober; unless I accept life completely on life's terms, I cannot be happy. I need to concentrate not so much on what needs to be changed in the world as on what needs to be changed in me and in my attitudes."

Dr. Paul O., "Acceptance Was the Answer,"  
Page 415, Alcoholics Anonymous, 4th edition.

When Dr. Paul O. died on May 19, 2000, our fellowship was deprived of a voice vital to many an alcoholic having a trying moment in the quest for sobriety.

In the June, 2000, issue of the Grapevine, a woman named Patty L., from San Diego wrote to complain about a roommate who wasn't sharing the load of residential tidiness. "Should I pray for her or just read Page 449 and let it go?" Page 449 was the location for the quoted paragraph at the top of this piece. But that was in the 3rd edition of our Big Book. It appears in its new location in the 4th edition.

The paragraph quoted at the top of this piece is used in the hope that it will be intriguing enough to make you want to read the entire article in the Big Book. There is much more about Dr. Paul to know than one simple paragraph. His experiences in locked wards and his often stormy marital relationship can give any of us insight on how to conduct ourselves at home and at work. When he spoke at a Harbor Area Traditions Banquet in the mid-90s, he was quick to acknowledge the gift of Alcoholics Anonymous and the great debt he owed to the Fellowship. He told us that late in their marriage he and his wife, Maxine, decided to change their morning meditation from a review of the Steps to an incisive review of the Traditions and how they worked in their lives. And he noted that acceptance was also the key to his relationship with God. He said he didn't just sit there and wait for God to tell him what to do. Instead he found things to do and when finished he left the results up to God.

The paragraph on Page 415 remains one of the most quoted (and most used) items when alcoholics face seemingly insurmountable obstacles in their relationships with family, friends or other AAs. The reason is obvious. When we let God handle the most difficult of our problems, He routinely does a better job than we could ever manage.

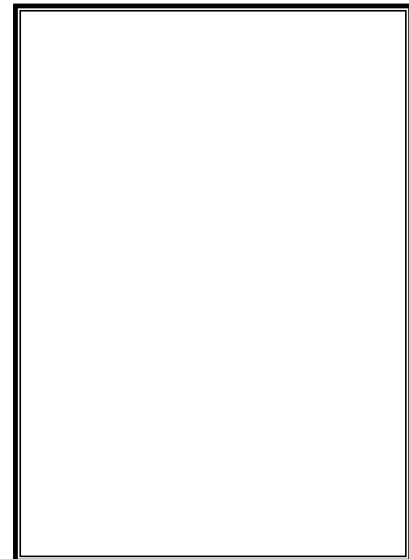

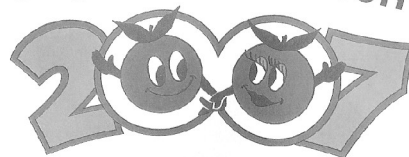
