## It Was Right There in Front of Me All the Time

Step 12: *“Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.”*

I had been attending our Thursday night 12 & 12 Step and Traditions Study meeting for over twenty years when the revelation finally hit me.

We had been fortunate to have had a visit from ten or more men from the Claremont Traveling Men’s Stag group at least once a year. The guys pile into cars, drive to some area in Southern California, have dinner and attend a meeting. There was a lot of good, long term sobriety in the group, and we always looked forward to their visit.

On this particular Thursday night, we were studying part 1 of Step 12, the spiritual awakening phenomenon. (We broke the step into its three logical parts.) I had been thinking that my own awakening had been somehow deficient even after a long stretch of sobriety. I could recall the struggle I had had with the second and third steps. Even after I had done the fourth and fifth, while I felt a tremendous relief and a total commitment to sobriety for the first time, I didn’t believe I had yet achieved any sort of valid spiritual growth.

That night, after reading in the “Twelve and Twelve”, one of the Claremont guys began to share. He said that he believed that a spiritual awakening happened when we were able to feel, think and do things that we never could before.

Wow! What a revelation. That had surely happened to me. I certainly felt differently since I had been given the gift of sobriety. I was no longer a victim burning with resentments. I thought differently; I now could see how my attitudes and actions had caused me so much trouble. And certainly I was now doing so many things that I couldn’t do before; think before reacting, take responsibility, do the next indicated thing, follow instruction, etc.

I thought, “How profound! He must have had a massive psychic change or a spiritual “flash” like Bill W.”

Later, someone pointed out to me a passage in the “Twelve and Twelve”; Page 106, the last sentence: “When a man or a woman has a spiritual awakening, the most important meaning of it is that he has now become able to do, feel, and believe that which he could not do before on his *unaided* strength and resources alone.” (Italics mine)

How many times had I read that in twenty plus years? At least 70 for certain. Why did it never make a permanent impression before this night? Then I remembered that I learned the steps by coming to this meeting in the first place. Doing the steps three times a year and the traditions once, produced little insights every week.

So there it was, my spiritual awakening/experience had been of the educational variety all along. This revelation just took a little longer. That's why I continue to go to step study meetings. I guess I can only handle a little "awakening" at a time.

## WHO SPEAKS FOR A.A.? TRADITION 12

Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities. -- Tradition 12, Alcoholics Anonymous.

The following anonymity statement came from the trustees of the Alcoholic Foundation, Inc., and was first published in the Grapevine for December of 1948.

Meeting in regular session, the trustees of the Alcoholic Foundation (now the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous) issued to whom it may concern the following statement regarding "Anonymity," and the use of the name Alcoholics Anonymous:

"The practice of anonymity in our public relations already has had a profound effect upon us, and in the years to come it will undoubtedly remain one of our vital Traditions.

"We would like to take this opportunity of thanking the press, radio and motion picture companies of the nation for the splendid job they have done and are doing to respect our Tradition of anonymity.

"Occasionally, there occurs a break in this Tradition; the name or picture of an A.A. member may be publicly printed, or he may speak or be spoken of by name in a radio interview. The responsibility for these regrettable, sometimes sensational, situations may rest with the A.A. himself. There are no rules or regulations that can bind him to the Tradition if he chooses to disregard the wishes of the movement as a whole. In some of these instances, the general public does not realize that the alluring temporary benefits of personal publicity must be ignored by us in favor of the long-term benefits of anonymity.

"So, if you are an A.A. member, or a friend of Alcoholics Anonymous, we earnestly request your personal cooperation in helping to maintain a worldwide policy of anonymity at the public level as expressed in the Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous.

"Our relations within the general public should be characterized by personal anonymity. We think A.A. should avoid sensational advertising. Our names and

pictures as A.A. members ought not to be broadcast, filmed, or printed publicly. Our public relations should be guided by the principle of attraction rather than promotion. There never is need to praise ourselves. We feel that it is better to let our friends recommend us!

"Finally, no person is authorized to speak for Alcoholics Anonymous, nor, obviously, should anyone introduce, publicly, the A.A. name into his own personal affairs or controversy at the public level."

In the early 1990s, the speaker at the Harbor Area Traditions Banquet made the following statement:

"I consider the Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous much more important to the health of A.A. than the Steps. If I don't do the Steps I may get drunk. Big loss. If we don't do the Traditions, there won't be any Alcoholics Anonymous."

In my important early days in AA, I tried so hard to do all the steps in the first month - - I failed. In due course of time, the message to keep it simple sunk in. More experienced members urged me to get acquainted with any and all newcomers, to spend my before and after meeting time with people who were floundering through the same early efforts as I. I did this, and for the first four or five months we spent hours in informal sessions "discovering" our answers together.

It worked! We found sobriety in the first and twelfth steps. My new friends became close friends, and made it possible for me to give up the old and find the new. Today, many of these same people are the closest personal friends I have, and our birthdays are close together.

## Gratitude Is An Action

*The last of 12 articles on service*

Have you ever been to a topic discussion meeting in A.A. where the topic chosen is gratitude? (About 4 out of 10 times, the topic chosen is gratitude, right?). And what generally occurs is that everyone expresses their gratitude for everything from their new job to their new spouse..... ad infinitum.

Now gratitude for these things is natural in us human beings, (sometimes not so natural in us alcoholics, though). But, too often, as the tableau plays out, the meeting highlights a contradiction. During the secretary's announcements, the secretary asks for an Intergroup Report – oh, yeah, we don't have an Intergroup Representative. A GSR report. Oh, yeah, the group doesn't have a GSR. The secretary asks for help in cleaning up, and the same 3 hands go up that go up every week. After the meeting the same members put the chairs away, empty the trash, sweep up, put the books and literature away and lock up. Same every week.

The contradiction? What happened to all that gratitude during the 90 minutes of the meeting? The dictionary defines gratitude as the state of being grateful; thankful. I believe that gratitude has to have a different meaning for me in A.A. Gratitude has to be an action. I cannot just tell you about my gratitude, I have to show you. If I'm grateful for A.A. how do I show it? Does my hand go up when volunteers are asked for? Am I willing to put aside the "contempt prior to investigation" and make myself available to be the Intergroup Rep or the GSR? Am I willing to put out my hand to the new person, or am I too busy talking to my friends who I haven't seen since yesterday? Am I willing to put out my hand to the unattractive newcomer – the drunk, the physically and mentally handicapped, the foul-smelling homeless person? Or do I leave that for someone else to do?

Alcoholics Anonymous gave me everything I have today – everything! How do I thank Alcoholics Anonymous? I have learned that I can't do it by sitting on my can in my home group. I've got to get up and do something. In early sobriety, one of the old-timers, (he had 6 years) told me, "That which I'm not grateful for, I don't get to keep". It has been my experience that all material things pass. The only thing that I can rely on every day is gratitude for Alcoholics Anonymous and the only way I can keep it is by being of service in and to Alcoholics Anonymous.

Of course, I could be wrong about all this and maybe I can just take the half measures way out and do nothing. I don't believe I'll try that.

The line on the wall in The First Step House of Orange County reads, "Grateful people are happy people, and those that aren't aren't". I like being

## CONCEPT XII

*[The Six]General Warranties of the Conference:*

*... in all its proceedings, the General Service Conference shall observe the spirit of the A.A. Tradition,...* The General Service Conference is the guardian of the Traditions of A.A. and the Traditions express the principles and attitudes of prudence that make for harmony in *all* our affairs.

*... taking great care that the Conference never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power;...* Warranty One: God, grant us enough money and authority to do our work, guard us against perilous wealth and power...and the wisdom to know the difference!

*...that sufficient operating funds, plus an ample reserve, be its prudent financial principle;...* Warranty Two: Participation in AA requires cash, as well as time, in order to assure that the "hand of AA always will be there."

*...that none of the Conference Members shall ever be placed in a position of unqualified authority over any of the others:...* Warranty Three: We in AA will not tolerate absolute human authority in any form...and we reinforce the idea with rights of appeal, participation and petition.

*... that all important decisions be reached by discussion, vote, and whenever possible, by substantial unanimity;...* Warranty Four: Talk, discuss, debate, listen, hear, decide! Because it requires a large majority to decide, the Conference speaks with the authority and confidence a simple majority could never give it.

*...that no Conference action ever be personally punitive or an incitement to public controversy;...* Warranty Five: No humanly administered system of penalties is needed; when we fail to follow sound spiritual principles, alcohol[ism] cuts us down. Public controversy, even in self-defense, is equally dangerous; we cannot risk resentments and conflicts that would certainly result were we ever to yield to the temptation to punish in anger.

*... that though the Conference may act for the services of Alcoholics Anonymous, it shall never perform any acts of government; and that, like the So-*

*ciety of Alcoholics Anonymous which it serves, the Conference itself will always remain democratic in thought and action.* Warranty Six: "To a man, we of AA believe that our freedom to serve is truly the freedom by which we live—the freedom in which we have our being."

*Note: Bill W.'s essay on Concept XII in Twelve Concepts for World Service is fourteen pages long. It is a masterpiece and should be required reading for every member of Alcoholics Anonymous...in my not-so-humble opinion.*
